

YANK FARMERS INVADE RUSSIA

Ten Thousand American Farmers May Go to Russia; Are expected to Revolutionize Farming Industry.

MOSCOW, Sept. 29.—(By Mail)—The Russian-American population of Soviet Russia now totals more than 20,000 persons. Ludwig Martens, formerly Soviet representative in the United States, who recently has been charged with the colonization of and assistance to the returning emigrants, told the Associated Press correspondent that about 10,000 Americans, 1922, 20,000 persons have come from America to Russia, thanks to the work of the Technical Aid Society, which has organizations in many American cities. Some of these colonists are men who left their homes in the United States and Canada, while others are perfectly contented in Russia. The correspondent has met both categories. All of them have had interesting experiences, and those who have lived long in America, or the native born Americans who found various colonies, are bringing something of American methods and American standards to the villages and farms all over Russia.

"The majority of those who have come from America and Canada to Soviet Russia are agricultural laborers and farmers," Mr. Martens said. "Of these there are several groups, for example at Tambour, Kaban and others. To each, if he desires to work in ground alone, the government of land is given, but if they work communally they can have as much land as they can farm."

At the present time, because of industrial difficulties, greater encouragement is extended to farmers to come to Russia than to industrial workers. Plans are now under way to bring over from the United States about ten thousand farmers for colonization in South Russia and Turkestan where they will be encouraged to grow cotton.

Of the farming groups already in Russia one of the most successful is that in the Tambour and Kaban governments, where the Russian-Americans have introduced tractors and other agricultural machinery and already have reaped one big harvest.

The correspondent has encountered more discontent among the industrial groups than among the farmers, but most of the little concerns started by factory workers from America seem to be more flourishing today than they were some months ago.

Among the industrial groups there are three tool and die workers who, under the name of the Link Tool Corporation group, are introducing die casting in Russia. There are also two groups of tailors, one long established, which has undergone varying fortunes, and the other, just arrived, which brought \$75,000 worth of equipment preparing to turn out American cut clothes.

MEX SOLDIERS SPIC AND SPAN

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 23.—(By Mail)—Even the critics of President Obregon are admitting today that he has accomplished real results in the matter of army reconstruction, and that parade of federal soldiers now in progress is a credit to his policy, but a howling of genuine indignation now, at least in appearance. The soldiers of the Obregon regime are well equipped and there is discipline in the marching ranks—things that have not been observed in Mexican soldiers for many years. On recent national holidays the war department held some public exercises for its troops, and several newspapers commented editorially on the fact that "at last Mexico has an army."

It is the intention of Secretary of War Obregon to retire the federal holding force to 30,000 men, and in recent statements he has said that his goal is almost reached. These 30,000 picked men are well uniformed and equipped with rifles of tested shooting powers, and when on parade they make a smart showing. Not so many years ago a Mexican army looked in appearance more of the count than the serious, and it was not unusual to see a company of men file by some of them loaded, some with caps and some with battered straw hats, rifles carried as suited their convenience, and all of them straggling along a road they could without any semblance of marching order.

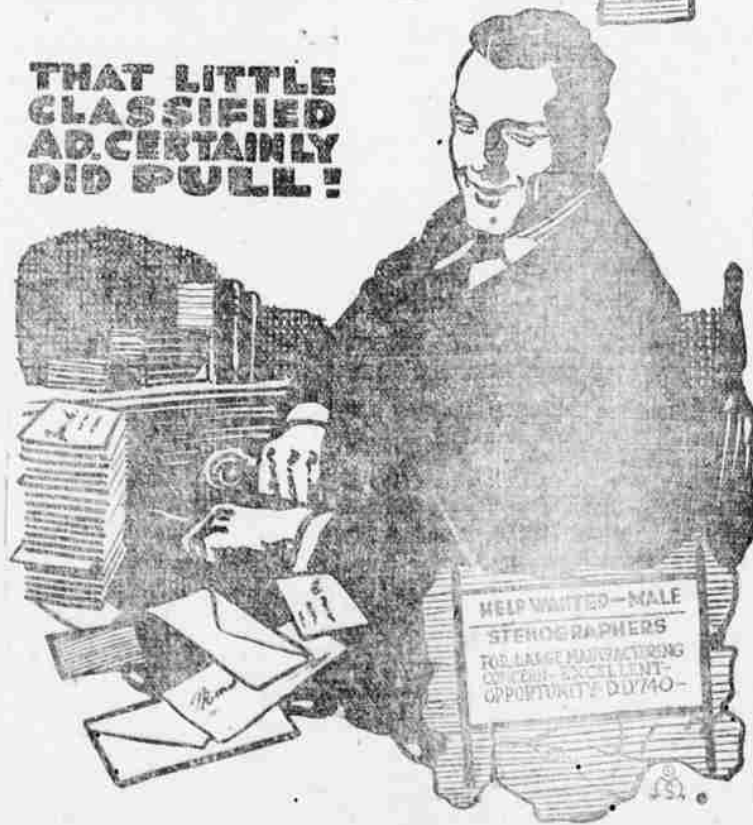
