GOVERNMENT TO HELP POOR
HAMBURG, Oct. 2.—(By Staff)—Two hundred and eighty million marks are required to help the poor of Hamburg city and state through the winter, according to an estimate of the public welfare office which has been submitted to the state senate. This sum would include the following provisions: 100,000,000 for general welfare activities, 20,000,000 for coal sufferers, 50,000,000 for reducing the price of milk, 40,000,000 for lowering the cost of coal, 20,000,000 for the establishment and conduct of school children's feeding, and 5,000,000 for aiding aged persons and limited wage-earners.
