AT SHERRYS LAST DAY "PAID BACK"

When a man gets what he wants too easily, he should beware. But there's a certain type of man who, though clever as can be in winning a woman's love, doesn't know when to distrust a woman he has wronged.

That theme is dramatically exploited in "Paid Back," the Universal all star attraction showing at the Sherry theater. Miss Brockwell, long a star herself, Stuart Holmes, villain de luxe of the screen, and Edna Murphy and Mahlon Hamilton handle these four central roles commendably. Kate Price presents another motherly characterization to add to her long list, but not as a mother, just as a companion to the girl.
