SALVATION ARMY WORK IS LISTED

Campaign Funds Based on Results Obtained in Past, Is the Claim.

Even though the Salvation Army has carried on a successful work for 17 years, its value to the various communities was not fully realized by the general public until a few years ago. It was the late World War that opened the eyes of the public. The unfortunates, but faithful workers soon made their mark on the battle fields of Europe, coming floods of letters to reach friends and loved ones at home, telling of the great work done by this organization over there. Up until this time the public in general realized the value of the work done by the Salvation Army, and therefore they had assumed an attitude of tolerance instead of appreciation of the great value of the organization.
"To not have availed ourselves of the honor during the war would have been folly," someone has declared. Even so, at the present time and in times of peace, many have come to realize the great necessity of the use in the battle fields of life. La Grande is no exception. The following report shows the necessity of the valuable work the Army is doing in Union county.
For the past year there has been a steady growth in the relief and rescue work in this county. Looking at the figures just presented to the advisory board for the past year's work we find that there have been held:
Two hundred open air meetings; approximate attendance 9575.

Two hundred fifteen indoor meetings; approximate attendance 3082.
Number of people forwarded to jail during year, 82.
Young people's meeting, 58; attendance, 1542.
Relief work during the year as follows:
Garments given away to worthy poor, 78.
Number of pairs of shoes, 123.
Lodgings, 72.
Positions found for unemployed, 42.
Meals furnished to hungry, 972.
Families given temporary relief, 182.
Number of persons in those families, 429.
Total relief for the year, \$902.85.
1000 House Visitation.
The officers in charge of the corps in this town and county during the past year have spent over one thousand hours in house-to-house visitation, seeking to alleviate the suffering of the poor and needy.
The fundamental principle of the Salvation Army is to help a man or a woman so that they can help themselves. The army endeavors to see each and every deed of kindness, each act of charity, and each branch of its work to make men and women self-supporting, better citizens, and capable of taking care of themselves.
It is the intention of the Salvation Army at this time to put on a financial campaign in this county to raise a budget for the relief and rescue work of the army for the coming year.
This campaign opens November 1st, ending November 10th and the quota \$2000.00.

CAMPAIGN SUM IS MADE PUBLIC

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—Three republican campaign committees—the national, senatorial and congressional—filed preliminary reports with the clerk of the house of representatives Friday, showing that \$721,255 had been contributed to help elect republican senators and representatives, of which amount \$645,451 has been expended.

Each committee will file another report prior to final ones, after the general election on November 7. The democratic senatorial committee, the Anti-Saloon League of America, the Associated Opposed to Prohibition and some minor organizations taking part in national politics will put in their financial statements by Saturday night.
Mellon Gives \$25,000.
Heading the list of all contributors was H. B. Mellon of Pittsburgh, brother of the secretary of the treasury, who gave \$25,000 through the republican national committee. John D. Rockefeller was second, with \$15,000, and John D. Rockefeller, jr., gave \$10,000. The Rockefeller, father and son, contributed also \$750 each through the republican congressional committee.
All told, there was eight \$10,000 contributions. They came from Mr. Rockefeller, jr., Fred Upham, as treasurer, to the senatorial committee; William Wrigley, jr., Chicago; Dr. S. G. Kennedy, Tulsa, Okla.; the New Jersey state central committee; Frederick W. Allen, New York; D. A. Reed, Pittsburgh, and Henry F. Lippitt, former senator from Rhode Island.
Records of the house clerk show that the republican national committee, in its preliminary report

filed October 18, 1920, a presidential campaign, reported contributions of \$2,166, 019, as compared with \$421,444 Friday. At the same time the republican senatorial committee reported receipts of \$179,485, compared with Friday's showing of \$135,069.
Smaller Contributions.
Mr. Upham's report for the national committee shows contributions of \$100 or more brought in \$260,195.16, while donations in sums of less than \$100 yielded \$23,469.
The individual contributions include \$5000 from Herbert Hoover, \$1000 from Postmaster General Work, \$1000 from (orn) Postmaster General Will Hays, \$1000 from Charles D. Warren of Detroit, ambassador to Japan; \$1250 from Eugene Meyer, jr., managing director of the war finance corporation; \$2500 from Paul M. Warburg, \$6000 from Julius Fleischman, \$1000 from Vincent Astor, \$5000 from James Patton of the Chicago board of trade.
