BETTY COMPTON SEEN AT SHERIDAN'S TODAY

Betty Compton will be seen at the Sheridan theater for two days, beginning today, in her second starring picture, "Always the Woman," released by Goldwyn. This production was made from a scenario by Percy Moore Sheehan and was directed by Arthur Rosson under Miss Compton's personal supervision. In the supporting cast are Macey Harlan, Emory Johnson, Doris Paxon, Gerald Prince, Richard Rosson and Arthur Delmore. In "Always the Woman" Miss Compton has the role of Celia Thaxter, a slangy New York girl who was trained in the hard school of cheap vaudeville, and who is en route to the Orient with a travelling troupe on a Mediterranean steamer. She inspires the unwholly love of Kelm Pasha, an eminent Egyptian statesman, who cannot make open advances to her. Kelm directs his jockey, Reginald Stanhope, to court Celia for him. Celia becomes interested in the case of one Boone, an American who is suffering from shell-shock, and who is being taken to the Orient because his wife is secretly enamored of Kelm Pasha. On the same ship is Mahmud, an Egyptian mystic, who tells Celia she was the Queen Nefer-Tokris in a former incarnation. He tells her of priceless treasure that is hidden in a lost tomb of Nefer-Tokris and Kelm organizes an expedition. The adventure of the caravan to the tomb carries the action of the picture into one of the most interesting narratives ever told on the screen and gives Miss Compton splendid opportunity to display her exceptional talents and versatility. CONSTANCE TALMADGE BECOMES FOOTLIGHT FAVORITE
Life's bitterest moment may be described as the day of unstinted ridicule; but Constance Talmadge faces her day of despair and gets away with it for a laugh as she romps before the footlights in "Polly of the Follies," her latest First National attraction that will be seen at the Arcade theater today, Friday and Saturday.
The breezy star of light comedies has a new viewpoint of the ambitious, stage-struck country girl, and she presents it in laughable fashion in original story that has been written for her by Jean Emerson and Anita Loos, authorities of good story writing for the screen.
