Addresses Dealing With Coal and Other Mining Industries to Be Given

(By Associated Press.)
VANCOUVER, B. C., Nov. 16.—Addresses dealing with the development of coal and other mining industries will be delivered by many notables in the North American mining fraternity at the western meeting of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, which is meeting here November 15 and 16.

Men of international fame, known wherever English speaking people are mining will be in attendance. Several prominent mining men of the United States will speak on various phases of the industry during the two-days' convention. President C. C. MacKenzie will open the conference with an address on "Industry Policy."

Moving pictures will also be a feature of the meeting. Gold mining in Ontario and the asbestos industry of Quebec will be screened at the opening session while on November 16 operations of the Trail, B. C. smelter will be shown.

Following the sessions here, the mining men will visit Nanaimo, where based on the coal mining industry of national scope and importance, will be delivered Friday, Nov. 17.
