

ART DONATIONS ARE RECEIVED

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Nov. 17.—Judge Charles H. Carey, a member of the board of directors of the Portland Art Museum, and Miss Bertha Stuart, a Portland artist, have made important donations of art books, collections of photographs and art magazines to the School of Architecture and Allied Arts of the University of Oregon, according to an announcement made here today by Dean E. P. Lawrence.

Books and materials, which the university will have difficulty in replacing, were lost in the fire that destroyed the art building on the campus last summer. The books and prints given to the university by Judge Carey and Miss Stuart will replace some of these losses.

The gift of Judge Carey is chiefly useful to students of architecture. The donor was a member of the jury of awards which has judged student work in painting and sculpture at the university and is a connoisseur. Judge Carey himself does interesting work in water color and modelling. He is the author of a history of Oregon, and this week presented to the university library two copies of this work.

The gifts of Judge Carey include prints of photographs of views in London, Stratford-on-Avon and Chester City, England.

Miss Stuart's gift includes Day's "Patterns and Designs," Vanderpoel's "Human Figure," Robinson's "Museum of Fine Arts, Boston," Tarbell's "History of Greek Art," Duvall's "Artistic Anatomy," Lurie's "Outlines of History of Art" in two volumes.

Professor E. E. DeCon, head of the department of mathematics at the university, has given the university library several books for use in the department of languages and science classes.

GERMANY IS KEYNOTE TO EUROPE PEACE

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 17.—Poland is viewing its approaching republicanism with a joy and patriotic fervor much like that which swept over the American colonies when they set up the world's first representative form of government, in the opinion of Francois de St. Phalle, vice president of the Baldwin Locomotive works who has returned from a locomotive-selling tour of Europe. Being president of the American-Polish Chamber of Commerce, he was especially interested in the affairs of Poland.

"The people of Poland are exhilarated over their independence and look forward with much expectancy to their first election in the next few weeks," said Mr. de St. Phalle in an interview. "It is hard to describe their feelings. They appear to have the same patriotic spirit and joyousness over their new found liberty that our forefathers experienced in 1776."

Mr. de St. Phalle said Poland, France, Belgium, Rumania, Czechoslovakia and Jugoslavia are closely agreed in principle and wish only to maintain peaceful relations with other countries. "They do not want war," he said, "and unless Germany be-

comes aggressive in an attempt to regain its lost territory I do not believe there will be another European conflict for some years."

"Poland is one of America's best future markets," he said. "Today it is buying cotton, copper, steel machinery and locomotives from the United States. It is fast rehabilitating its devastated areas and its railroads of some 11,000 miles even now
