(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—Anglers, guides and sportsmen generally, who are interested in conservation of the country's inland game fish supply are warned by the Bureau of Fisheries to take special pains to prevent forest fires, as these have been responsible for widespread destruction of fish.

Streams that once teemed with trout now have not a single fish as the result of a forest fire, bureau officials say. They believe their destruction resulted from the increased alkalinity of the water, due to the leaching out of the ash left by the fire.

(By Associated Press) COPENHAGEN, Oct. 28.—A warship of the Vikings, dating back to about 1000 A. D., was found on view here at the National Museum. It was found in the bog of Hovorslev, in Slesvig, Denmark, and its remains found with the vessel also will be on view.
