## "CONFIDENCE" AT SHERRY'S

Herbert Rawlinson appears on the screen of the Sherry theater at his best for the last time today in his latest Universal starring vehicle, "Confidence," a Bernard Hymal story, adapted to the screen by Raymond L. Schroek, scenario editor at Universal City.

Rawlinson portrays in his own inimitable style a travelling salesman, sent out upon an assignment whereon he must either make good and land a contract or lose his job. He doesn't land the contract, but he sells his prospect's daughter the idea of matrimony and wins her for his wife. He is fired, of course, but that doesn't dishearten him in the least. Gaining new confidence and self assurance by suddenly discovering that he is rich, he sets about establishing one of the world's greatest industrial plants right there in that little two-cylinder town.

The star is supported by a brilliant cast of players all admirably suited to their roles. Playing the lead opposite Rawlinson is Harriet Hammond, while others playing important parts are Lincoln Plumer, William A. Carroll, Otto Hoffman, William Harry Daly, Hallam Cooley, John Stepping, Melbourne MacDowell, Gerald Pring, Robert Millach and Sam Allen.

Harry A. Pollard, who directed "Confidence" is responsible for many human interest bits injected into the story and a light vein of humor that winds its way throughout. What, not a single moral is expounded, "Confidence" should be an inspiration for young men with tendencies toward discouragement.

This latest Rawlinson vehicle can be summoned up in one word—"pep." Also showing the Carter de Heens in their latest success, "Entertaining the Boss," which is said to be funnier than their big hit, "Twin Husbands."
