FRISCO LIKES COMIC OPERA

Rivoli Opera House in San Francisco Enjoys Daily Patronage of Great Numbers.

(By Associated Press.)
SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 24.—San Francisco has demonstrated that its interest in comic operas, old and new, has not waned by the manner in which it is flocking to the Rivoli Opera House. The operas, presented by Farris Hartman and Paul Steinhardt, famous in local annals as having presented here thirty-five years ago at the old Rivoli Opera House, comic operas that were in vogue at that time, can be seen for prices ranging from 25 cents to \$1.

Hartman and Steinhardt are putting on operas of the original manner they were staged years ago. Their presentation of "The Children of Normandy," "The Bohemian Girl," and other such old favorites show a touch that none of the present day managers attempt.

Hartman, after a long venture in the motion picture world, returned here to the scene of his earlier triumphs, with the idea of presenting the old favorites but he lacked financial backing. He conceived the idea of asking the public if a revival of the operas would be supported and he appeared before civic organizations and clubs explaining his plan.

After he had been assured verbally that the public wanted comic operas of other days, he sold twelve admissions for \$10. Even after he had \$1,500 in the bank from the sale of tickets he was afraid to make the venture, fearing failure, but eventually he took an option on the Oakland, Cal., auditorium, hired a company and last May, with Steinhardt, began producing comic operas.

The operas were presented to crowded houses in Oakland for several weeks and then Hartman and Steinhardt moved their company to San Francisco and took over a motion picture theater which they named the Rivoli Opera House. Hartman and Steinhardt got their following at the old Rivoli and in obtaining the theater here they obtained it as easily as they could, so that the theater they helped to make famous.

The Rivoli is original in that the patrons decide which operas the com-

pany is to produce. Hartman and Steinhardt have purchased a list of fifty operas and have announced they will present the operas that receives the highest vote of the patrons. "The Children of Normandy," "The Bohemian Girl," and "Robin Hood" are among the old time favorites voted for.

The Rivoli following the plan of the earlier theaters of San Francisco has a bar at which "drinks which the law allows" are sold in the "Blue Room" cigarettes are given to the women patrons.

DEN OF GOLDEN BEARS TO RISE

Great Memorial Athletic Stadium to Be Built in Strawberry Canyon by University of California.

BERKELEY, Cal., Nov. 24.—A great memorial athletic stadium—already named the "Yon" at the Golden Bear—is soon to rise in Strawberry Canyon, in the Berkeley hills on the University of California campus here. The stadium is to cost \$1,000,000 and will seat 72,000.

The new stadium will be built on a site bounded by the Golden Gate and the University of California buildings. This is made possible by the unique location of the site on the slopes of the canyon.
