PLANT CITY, Fla., Nov. 28.—Thanksgiving strawberries will come high this year, for buyers are paying \$4.25 a quart for them delivered on the railroad platform here. Plant City, center of the production area in Florida, began its shipping Friday, the earliest date in seven years. The bidding opened at \$4.25 a quart and the berries rapidly went up to \$4.25, while bids went as high as \$4.50 with no buyers in sight.

One farmer received a check for \$72.00 for 17 quarts, the best actual sale price of the day.

\$50,000 PAID FOR ONE PLANT OF STRAWBERRY

THREE RIVERS, Mich., Nov. 28.—Fifty thousand dollars was the price paid by Frank E. Beatty, president of the R. M. Kellogg company, this city, for a single strawberry plant. This is probably the highest price ever paid for any single variety of that fruit. The plant is to be known as "Rockhill, America's greatest Strawberry," being named in honor of the breeder, Harlow Rockhill of Conrad, Ia.

Mr. Beatty said that the price paid was not because he expected to make a profit from sales of the plant, but as an incentive to growers and breeders of plants to develop new varieties. This particular plant bears early in the summer, exactly the same as the ordinary strawberry, but during the late summer again begins bearing and continues until frost stops the growth of the fruit.
