ENTERPRISE IS DEFEATED 45-0 BY LA GRANDE

 last soon this year. The half ended La Grande 15, Enterprise 0.
 In the third quarter Sherwood returned the kickoff to the 60 yard line, La Grande punted, Enterprise pass intercepted by Chet, La Grande gained 15 yards, La Grande held for downs, Enterprise punt goes out of bounds, Kerr goes 8, 12 and then over with Metcalf converting. Enterprise held for downs following kickoff, punted to La Grande, Chet went 5, Kerr 3, Chet 1, hold for downs, Enterprise punted, LaGrande punted and Enterprise returned. Quarter ended La Grande 29, Enterprise 0.

Last Quarter Snappy.
 In the last quarter La Grande marched 50 yards for touchdown, Metcalf scoring but failing to convert. Enterprise punted and Tipp went 15, Sherwood 10, Kerr 8, Tip 2, Sherwood 7, Tip 5 and over, Metcalf failed to convert. La Grande kicked, Larson intercepted Enterprise pass, and went out due to injuries. Hammelt went in for Boarden who replaced Larson, Boarden went 10, Kerr 2, Sherwood 40, Metcalf 8 through center, Sherwood 15, Kerr 8, Sherwood 2, Boarden 5 and over. Metcalf converted. The final score being 45 to 0 in favor of La Grande.

La Grande faced a much stronger team than was expected and was stowed up considerably by the condition of the field. Notwithstanding the Blue and White made 34 first downs to Enterprise's 2 from scrimmage, and scored off 499 yards to Enterprise's 47. La Grande completed one out five passes and Enterprise tried seven to no avail. La Grande's pass netted 26 yards.

 Long and Tibbitts starred for Enterprise and Smith, Alamo, Larson, Kerr, Boarden, Hammelt, (the Metcalf brothers and Sherwood) all played chunky ball for La Grande. The team will return to La Grande this evening on the branch line train.

POPE PRAISES U. S. CUSTOM

Receives American Students Thanksgiving Day and Holiday is Observed.

ROME, Dec. 1.—For the first time in the history of the Catholic church, the pope joined in an American national festival when he invited Thursday evening upon receiving the students of the American college and addressed them on the topic of Thanksgiving day.

The students, numbering 180, were accompanied to the audience chamber by Cardinal Bissini and by the rector and vice rector of the college.

In his address the pope said: "National Thanksgiving! It is a noble idea on the part of your people—choosing the day for prayer. Men who lack prayer lack one of the essentials of life. Your country must indeed be blessed by Almighty God."

In accepting an offering of 1200 lire from the students and their supporters, he thanked them "for the help you have given me for the missions, Russia, mown down by pestilence, famine and misery."

Congratulate America.
 The pope said that, through the American students, he wished to congratulate the entire American people and express his gratitude for the generosity they had shown on every occasion of need.

In his address the pontiff said: "It is comforting to see the heads of nations fixing days for the people to pray and thank God for blessings received. Nations doing this cannot but prosper materially and spiritually. I am with you, with your people on the day of Thanksgiving. We are praying together."
 The pontiff ended the reception by imparting the apostolic benediction to the students and their supporters and extending it to the American people.

The American college celebrated Thanksgiving day with a dinner which was attended by Cardinal Bissini and Americans of the various ecclesiastical orders.

Many American families also gave dinner, church of Madonna Guiller and Mrs. Quinter tendered a reception in the entire American colony at the American embassy.
