THIEF VALLEY ROAD SURVEY IN PROGRESS

The state highway commission is now conducting a survey for the new line of road to be installed when the Thief Valley Irrigation project gets under way. The new line will be from Bidwell hill, about four miles this side of North Powder, to North Powder, approximately one-half mile west of the present highway. When the maximum dam is installed across the Powder river the waters will cover the present highway and the new highway, although about one-half mile longer, will necessarily have to be built.

The government fieldwork has been going on in Thief Valley for some time and recently the state highway commission ordered a survey of the road. The proposed road will be approximately three and one-half miles in length, and the survey will be completed by December 10.
