

THREE RAID YOUTHS PARTY

ENTERPRISE, Dec. 6. — Three young men from Flors headed out to the charge of petty larceny on Tuesday before Justice A. H. Conway and were fined \$25 each. They admitted they broke into the Paul Moore house in Flors and carried away two boxes of ice cream which had been prepared for a party of school children in honor of Herbert Baker's sixteenth birthday.

The three who confessed they raided a children's party were Frank Hefrow, who is married, and Pierce Praxler and Alva Pordie, younger boys. They were brought to Enterprise by Sheriff P. D. Hinchman and after learning that burglary by breaking into a house in a penitentiary offense, they concluded to plead guilty to petty larceny and get off as easy as possible.

The party was at the present home of Wayne, Ladd and Esther Moore and some 25 school pupils were present, and also Mrs. Haxson, Mrs. Baker and Mr. and Mrs. Ladd. Refreshments of cake and ice cream had been prepared and the ice cream was in a room on the lower floor. Several young men gathered about and presently removed a window sash and carried away the ice cream.

Carrying their prize to a vacant lot, the men built a bonfire and proceeded to have a high old time with their stolen goods. The town was so indignant that constables were sworn out and the arrests followed.

For months there have come to the court house and to everybody else, complaints of rowdiness by a crowd of grown boys with empty heads who have disturbed church and school gatherings in Flors and elsewhere in the neighborhood. This is the first instance where the injured persons have sworn out warrants. If they will follow up this movement the weight of the whole community organization will be thrown into the prosecution and the moonshiners landed in jail. Enterprise Chiefman.
