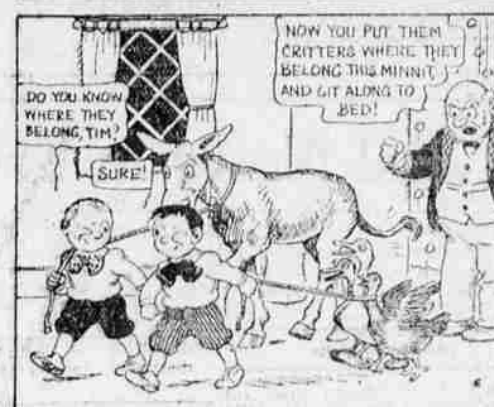


TIM -- THE KELLY KIDS -- TOM

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BEAVER FARMING

Although the practicability of beaver farming has not been fully demonstrated, the United States department of agriculture believes that the business of raising beavers for their fur may develop, under proper control measures, into a profitable branch of fur farming. With a small beginning the enterprise seems to promise an advance

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The animals should not be introduced uncontrolled into places where their activities may menace irrigation or power ditches, important road or railroad grades or agricultural districts. A suitable food supply and permanent water should be assured.
