T. B. DEATHS ON DECREASE

Oregon Has Less Deaths from Tuberculosis in 1921 Than 41 of 48 States in Union.

Deaths from tuberculosis, all forms of the disease, are steadily on the decrease in Oregon, according to a report made by the department of commerce. In a comparison of the 48 states in the Union, Oregon has a less death rate than 41 of the states and has a higher death rate than but six states, Michigan, Vermont, Montana, Kansas, Utah and Nebraska, who are ranked respectively in the table.

The number of deaths in Oregon in 1921 was 608, in 1920, 703 and in 1919, 704, showing a steadily decreasing rate. On tables showing a true estimate of the percentage of deaths per 100,000 population, Oregon in 1921 is rated at but 76 deaths. The figures show that 89.1, 90.6, 88.1 deaths per 100,000 people during the years of 1920, 1919 and 1918 respectively.

OREGON BEGINS HOOP SEASON

Although Placing Last in Conference Standings in Past Season, Hopes Are High This Year.

EUGENE, Dec. 8.—Now that the 1922 football season is over, interest in University of Oregon sport circles is shifting from the gridiron to the gymnasium. Preliminary work in basketball, the most important of the winter indoor sports, is now under way.

In 1921-22 Oregon ended the conference season in last place in the official basketball standings. Coach Bohler's explanation is that his varsity squad, composed almost entirely of sophomores, lacked the experience and team play that makes a championship team. Coach Bohler also believes that his team's poor showing was due in part to the fact that many of the other conference schools last year had the strongest quintets they had produced in years.

However, he believes conditions will be reversed this year, because, he says, not only will some of last year's strongest combinations will be broken up this season, but Oregon is going to have a much stronger team this year than last. Coach Bohler makes no promise as to where Oregon is going to place this season. However, he does say, "Oregon probably will not produce a championship team this year. We will have a fighting team that will give the other teams a race, and our team will be just one year better than it was last year, for most of the squad is back." Eight letter men will be eligible this year. Members of the freshmen basketball squad are practicing against the varsity every afternoon. Oregon's first northwest conference game will be with Willamette University at Eugene January 16.
