WOULD PROTECT ALFALFA CROP

H. H. Weatherspoon, Horticulture Official, Appeals Before the County Court.

Appearing before the county court yesterday H. H. Weatherspoon, horticulture official of the state, laid before that tribunal the exact conditions that confront the alfalfa grower of the Grande Ronde valley. Mr. Weatherspoon did not deal in platitudes but stated facts which are too well known by the government and state officials. That the weevil which destroys alfalfa travels about thirty miles a year, and that it started in Utah several years ago and has reached west as far as Baker county, there is not the least doubt. All Southern Idaho can testify to the damage done by the little bug, and when once it gets installed in a field, there is little that can be done to fight it.

Mr. Weatherspoon's mission was to warn the county court of the approaching weevil and enumerate the different things that can be done to keep it from entering Union county. Freight shipments of hay or stock cars carrying alfalfa for stock bedding can easily be handled, but the thing that California is watching now is the tourist who makes his bed on the ground, then rolls up his bed and alfalfa carrying weevil sticks to that bed thus letting the little bug get started in a new territory. Eternal vigilance is the price to pay for keeping the weevil out of Union county, said Mr. Weatherspoon, and there must be provisions made for stopping and searching tourists—not for hootch, but for weevil.

State Should Assist. Taking the view that the state should patrol the "line of demarcation" into territory under a hay shipping quarantine placed upon certain sections in the eastern part of Baker county some months ago, H. H. Weatherspoon of Elgin, a member of the state horticultural board, has written County Judge J. L. Dodson that within the near future the former will interview Governor-elect Pierce to that end, says the Baker Democrat.

In his letter, received by Mr. Dodson yesterday, Mr. Weatherspoon declared he would urge the governor-elect to use his influence in getting legislation permitting of state regulation of weevil-infested hay at state expense.
