O.-W. Officials Issue Statement Regarding Equipment on Their Lines.

According to O.-W. officials bad order cars at the present number considerable less than a year ago. The company, after a survey of equipment, has issued the following statement:

In view of the stringent car situation that has been prevalent for the past few weeks a check was made of bad order cars on the O.-W. R. & N. as of November 1st this year compared with same date last year and it is interesting to note that there were 208 less bad order cars on the O.-W. R. & N. this year than last. The figures show:

Bad order cars on hand November 1, 1921, 316.

Bad order cars on hand November 1, 1922, 408.

Number of cars less this year, 208.

Bad order cars are repaired on an average of about 225 per day.
