

GERMAN PRINCE IS NOT WELCOME

American Legion Head Objects to Proposed Visit of War Enemy at This Time

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Dec. 14.—Alvin Owsley, national commander of the American Legion, in an address at the first Presbyterian church here to the state adjutants of the American Legion assembled in national conference in Indianapolis, declared that "only yesterday in New York, I was informed that plans are being made for a visit of the ex-royal prince of Germany to the United States within the next six months."

"Now a commander of the German navy is coming over to tell us in the German language what the war was about," the national commander continued. "Certainly the time is not propitious for any of their ilk and his to reason their doctrine."

"I believe we would be entirely within our rights to bar from this country every man who made war against us until we can settle our own problems resulting from that war."

Fresh from conference in Washington with President Harding and government officials regarding care of the disabled, Mr. Owsley spent a day in New York City investigating at first hand conditions in Veterans Bureau and contract hospitals.

Accompanied by local New York Legion officials, Commander Owsley went to the Kingsbridge hospital, in the Bronx, where some 1500 ex-servicemen receive treatment for mental and physical disorders. The commander investigated the kitchen, sleeping quarters, dispensary, and recreation buildings and shared with the patients. He expressed himself pleased with conditions.

His next stop was the Seton tuberculosis hospital at Spuyten Duyvil, a state institution. He found it to be a high grade hospital but not entirely suitable for veterans because of the presence of civilian patients and lack of constant government supervision.

Commander Owsley was accompanied by Garrett Day, chairman of Legion rehabilitation committee for District Number 2; Irwin Ira Baekoff, Legion district chairman, New York; G. A. Holliday, representing the New York Legion, and W. F. Lent, manager of the Veterans Bureau, Second District.

Commander Owsley addressed New Jersey Legionnaires in Newark, before he departed for Indianapolis.

PRESIDENT IS ASKED TO AID

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—Requests that the President seek to broaden the scope of naval limitation in the armament race so to include the limitation of the construction of the smaller types of war vessels and military and naval aircraft were included in the annual naval bill reported today by the House appropriations committee. The president was asked to open negotiations with Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan for an agreement limiting the building of all surface and submersible war craft of a tonnage of ten thousand or less and of all classes of war aircraft.
