BROTHERS ARE STAR GRIDISTS

BERKELEY, Calif., Dec. 14.—To the list of brothers who have fought their way to the top in Pacific coast intercollegiate athletics has been added the names of the Nichols brothers, Luther and Don, of the University of California. In addition to being prominent in student affairs, they are nephews of Dr. David P. Barrows, president of the university. Luther Nichols, or "Lute," as he is generally known, formerly cap-

tained the varsity track team, later was graduate manager and now is general manager of student affairs. Don, one of the best halfbacks ever produced at California, has just been elected to captain the 1923 football machine.

Varsity men are telling of an incident that occurred when Don was elected captain at the close of the season. It seems that Luther had never even thought of his brother being chosen captain and the news came as a big pleasant surprise. When Don was chosen, Luther was very enthusiastic and hugged his brother for several minutes. "Think of it," Lute said, "my little brother Don being captain of the greatest football team in the world next season."

Local News in Brief

Ballock in Portland—

"We are keeping the snow clear on the old Oregon trail between La Grande and Baker, but we haven't been able to clear the Oregon-Washington highway between Athena and Weston because our equipment didn't get there in time," says H. H. Ballock, division engineer of the highway department, who is in the city. "It will be an easier matter to keep the highway across the blue mountains open hereafter than to keep the section between La Grande and Baker clear. In the latter section the snow drifts, whereas in the mountains, in the Kamela section, the snow falls straight down and doesn't drift. Snow fences will have to be built at several places east of La Grande, save in the Tolovet section, where the railroad has its fences. The state highway department is being equipped with equipment to handle snow conditions as the roads can be kept open, and this work is now going on at several places. 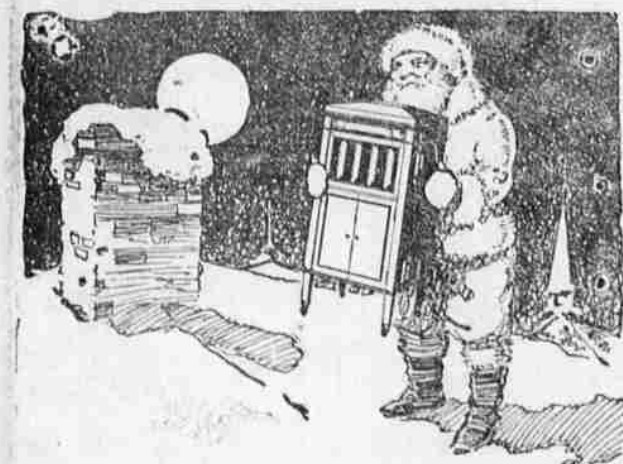
