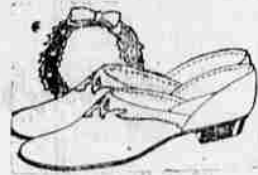

PIERCE NOW AT CAPITOL

Governor-elect of Oregon and Ward Irvine, His Secretary, Arrive in Salem.

SALEM, Dec. 20.—Governor-elect Walter M. Pierce, accompanied by his private secretary, Ward Irvine of Portland, arrived in the capital city this morning to give the state departments and state institutions the "once over" and familiarize themselves with the duties which they will assume on January 8.

The governor-elect plans to spend today and Thursday in Salem, says the Portland press, going to Lebanon, Friday, and then returning to his home in La Grande to close up his private affairs there preparatory to moving to the capital shortly after the first of the year.

Definite announcement by Pierce this morning that no consideration would be given to appointments at least until the legislative session will no doubt serve to ease the tension under which some of the appointive officials have been laboring since the election returns became known.

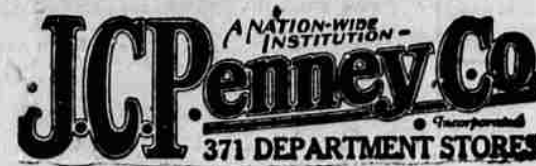
"Of course should a vacancy occur I would have to fill it, I suppose," the governor-elect said, "but I do not propose to give the matter of appointments any consideration until after I have had time to familiarize myself with the situation and become settled in my office."

More than 300 office seekers have already made formal application for the six or eight positions which he will have to fill, Pierce explained this morning. More than 50 applicants are out for a position on the industrial accident commission alone, with only three positions thereon available. The insurance commissioner's position seems to be the second most popular plum, Pierce said.

While in Portland he said he was continuously besieged by job hunters and half a dozen or more applicants for a place on the state payroll met him at the station when his train arrived here this morning.

Irvine, a member of the editorial staff of The Oregon Journal, plans to spend two or three days in Salem at this time getting acquainted with his new duties and will come to Salem about the first of the year to spend the week in the office with Don H. Upjohn, private secretary to Governor Oleott, getting a line on the work to which he will fall heir.

SPECIAL EXAM IS ANNOUNCED

Examinations for the Bible Study and Outside Music to Be Held on January 19.

Principal E. D. Towler, of the La Grande high school, announces that data as been sent him by Superintendent J. A. Churchill regarding the conducting of bible and outside music examinations with the view of procuring high school credits. Examinations will be held in the high school building on January 19. One half year's credit or unit will be given to the student passing the examinations successfully for each half year's work.

The questions on the bible study will deal with both the new and old testament, the former to be held in the afternoon and the latter in the forenoon. The questions are sent to the principal by the state department and then are returned, when answered, for grading.

The credits for outside music are given in regards to the hours spent in practice, the ability of the students and the other requirements ordinarily taken up, and these must be certified by the music teacher and then approved by the high school principal.
