

CATTLE SNOWED IN NEAR PARK

THE PARK, Dec. 23.—John B. Hunter and family, through the new columns of The Park, wish to extend thanks to Clarence Vanorder, Kenneth Vanorder, Joseph Lay, Bert Vanorder, Ed Gillespie, L. J. Foster, Chester Godday, of The Park and Lower Catherine Creek. And also to Robert Waunker, Harley Herach and Winn Duncan of the Creek and Medical Springs, for their prompt and kind assistance in responding to the family's call for help in searching for their son and brother-in-law, Adolph A. Groupe, who so tragically lost his life in the mountains.

At the first call from the telephone from the Hunter home, Clarence Vanorder and Joseph Lay rode horseback across the mountain, a distance of five miles, on the night of Wednesday, before the body was found, in order to be on the ground early Thursday morning.

Ed Gillespie, down on the creek, organized at once what men were available, and they were up there on the search early.

Bob Waunker of Big Creek was notified by Clarence Vanorder and with the others they went by the way of "Faller Green," coming down towards the others.

The father-in-law, John B. Hunter,

had it well organized, sending the searchers two by two in the different directions and directing the Big Creek contingent to come down towards the others, having a complete circle formed around the locality where the lost man was supposed to be. A code of signal was given the searchers in case he was found by either party, by firing three shots in succession, telling the others that he was found.

Chester Godday was dispatched on the North Fork trail, as he was well acquainted with the trail. Kenneth Vanorder and Mr. Foster were going on to Buck Ridge when Mr. Godday found the body stiff and cold just a half mile from the homestead of his father-in-law and about one mile and a half from his own home.

This is about the most tragic affair occurring in and around The Park since it was established. All are somewhat over the greatest shock of the sad affair but it will be remembered for many years. The sympathy as well as real assistance was given to the bereaved family.
