

One and seven-tenths mills have been cut from the combined state and general tax levies for the coming year, according to the levy which has been adopted by the members of the county court of Union county. The levy for the coming year is 17.1 mills, against 18.3 mills for this year. This reduction was made chiefly in the general fund and the road fund, although the new levy contained \$20,000 more for road bond interest than did the old.

The total assessed valuation of both personal and real property for the coming year has been established at \$6,212,169.26, which is less than the previous valuation which was \$26,173,816.

Millage Division:

The millage is divided as follows:

general fund, \$19,407, millage, 7.91
state fund, \$14,521.77, millage, 7.91
high school fund, \$5,319, millage, 1.91
high school fund, \$17,000, millage, 1.01
library fund, \$11,713, millage, .82
road fund, \$17,500, millage, 1.43
market road fund, \$2,280, millage, 1.12
road bond interest fund, \$50,000, millage, 2.28. Grand total \$49,032.77, millage, 17.1.

The general fund in 1923 was \$19,999 more or about \$10,000 than this year and the road fund was \$1,000 less this year. Fourteen thousand was saved in the state fund this year. \$75,000 were made in each fund with the exception of the high school fund, which is about exactly the same and road bond interest fund which was \$50,000 this year against \$48,000 for last year.
