LOCAL MINER IS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT MINES

"The prospects for striking a rich vein of gold on our properties in the Blackboy group are very optimistic," remarked Jerry L. Crouse, of La Grande, who with his brother William L. Crouse, own large interests in the Susanville district a few miles from Austin. Mr. Crouse is visiting his brother during the holidays and expects to return to Susanville where he is now making his quarters after New Year's day.

"At present we have considerable quantities of the lower grade ores, assaying at from \$8 to \$50 per ton, most of it that will be shipped to the Sumpter smelters as soon as they begin operations. With the opening of the smelter the entire country will be highly benefited as one of our greatest difficulties in the past has been experienced in shipping the ore to the smelters.

"What we are waiting for," he continued, "is the finding of a higher class vein, which I am sure will be brought to light in the ensuing season. I have found smaller evidences of the existence of such a vein but we still have not located the larger body.

"The Blackboy group of mines is situated where a medley of veins cross in two mineral zones, being about one-half mile in width and the timber and water conditions are splendid. Much work has already been completed on our mines and I look to the development of the Susanville district to progress to a high point."

Punching the Clock---

You, as your own household manager, can check up the actual service given each month by the simple process of subtracting the reading on the dials at the time the meter man checks your "time clock," or meter from the reading taken next month. These readings show on your bill each month.
