AT SHERRIFF'S TODAY AND TOMORROW. "FOUR HORSEMEN" SUPREME FILM PRODUCTION

An epic tale of surging passion sweeping from the wide plains of the Argentine through the fascinating travelties of pre-war Paris into the blating turmoil of the German invasion of northern France.

REAL DIAMONDS ARE DISPLAYED IN "PINK GODS"

A production hitherto not usually considered, has been met in Penrhyn Stanlaw's Paramount production of "Pink Gods," a picture featuring Hebe Daniels and James Kirkwood. This is the danger of loss and cost of insurance of tens of thousands of dollars worth of diamonds and jeweled pieces, which are seen in the picture.

The theme of "Pink Gods" which comes to the Arcade Theater Friday and Saturday is the fatal lure of diamonds for women, and the dramatic action revolves about a young wife, played by Miss Daniels, and the lengths of indignation to which she goes to obtain the precious stones. Mr. Kirkwood is seen as John Queich, the man who made Kimberly's, and the man who has in his gift innumerable gems.

Such is the effect of the "Pink Gods" upon the character played by Miss Daniels that she is required to go into what amounts to a state of hypnosis, while making at some of the wonderful gems in order to make these convincing. These gems were placed in a safe deposit each night, and removed in the morning by a plainclothes officer, who turned them over to Miss Daniels when they were needed for scenes. This officer never got farther from the star than just outside the camera lines, and he was responsible for the safe return of the jewelry at night.

The remarkable cast of "Pink Gods" which is from a story by Cynthia Stockley, includes Hebe Daniels, James Kirkwood, Ann Q. Nilson, Raymond Hatton, Adolphe Menjou and others as well known. The adaptation was made by J. E. Nash and Sonya Leyden.
