Everday Psychology

It is interesting to observe the increasing application of the principles of psychology to the solution of the problems of everyday life. The science of the mind, once looked upon as a frill of education, now plays an important part in the affairs of business.

The importance of the study now being made of the mind will be more appreciated in later years; for as yet the researchers have done little more than scratch the surface. Up until the last century there was little accurate knowledge of the processes of the mind.

Psychology is teaching how to educate the mind, to stimulate the imagination, improve the memory, form good habits, and get rid of bad ones. As man learns more of the operations of the subconscious part of the mind, he increases his mental powers.

There is another department of psychology which has been brought into undeserved disrepute by the frauds of charlatans, but which is the most fascinating of all the branches of the science in the possibilities that it seems to hold. This is the branch which Sir Oliver Lodge calls "psychic science."

Psychology is the big science of the Twentieth century, just as biology was dominant in the Nineteenth; and it is encouraging to find business men interested in it because of the help that it offers in the solution of their problems.

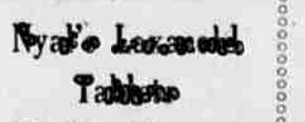
