"The Kentucky Derby" Adapted from Famous Melodrama. Highly Entertaining.

Sweeping from the rolling hills and blue grass estates of old Kentucky to the shipyard dens of New York and then to the rocky promontories of an island off the coast of far-away China, "The Kentucky Derby" unfolds a thrilling and romantic breadth of action on the screen of the Arcade theatre today, Friday and Saturday.
