WALLOWA TAX RATE IS CUT

WALLOWA, Jan. 8.—The tax rate for Wallowa has been fixed at 55.7 mills by Assessor John McDonald. This is a reduction of 8.4 mills from the 64.1 mill assessment of last year. The amount to be raised by taxation this year, not including special school levies, is \$91,266.50. This amount is \$20,000 less than last year.
