## COLLEGES ARE IN CONFUSION

Dr. Robert Kelly States that Higher Educational Institutions are Confused in Their Purpose.

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, Jan. 12.—Confusion in the purpose of a college education in the higher institutions of learning, a condition to which the elective system has contributed as well as the general influence of science, was indicated in an address here today by Dr. Robert L. Kelly of New York, executive secretary, before the annual meeting of the Council of Church Boards of Education. "The charge frequently is made that students in liberal arts colleges—the core of American higher education—work without aim or program," said Dr. Kelly. "In the judgment of these critics absolute confusion exists in these strongholds as to the purpose of a college education. The multiplication of plans for unifying college courses such as the required course in contemporary civilization for freshmen at Columbia University, the requirement of an examination in the Bible and Shakespeare at Harvard, and others, indicates a tacit confession of the truthfulness of the criticism and an effort to correct the abuse. "Nearly all of these plans for unifying the curriculum are examples of effort to unify the materials of the curriculum. In the light of the vast amount of curriculum material available today it is manifest that there can be no unity on the basis of curriculum material. "The liberal arts college with religious traditions has an opportunity to offer a plan for unifying the college curriculum on the basis of religion. The main business of the college course is to give the student a philosophy of life and the American college with religious traditions faces a unique opportunity at this moment."

## HUSKIES TO BE STRONGER

SEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 12.—The University of Washington basketball team, which opens its season against the Whitman college opponent here January 12, will be a much stronger aggregation than the one which finished fourth in the Pacific Coast conference race last year, according to Clarence Edmundson coach. "Three letter men, Captain Elmer Lewis, forward; "Windy" Crawford and Jimmy Bryan, guards, are turned out and have shown improved form. Bob Heak, the star tennis player, and Ed Kemp, football letter man, are vying for the position at center. Gundlach, a new player, is giving Bryan a race for place as stationary guard. Payne, a substitute of last year, Welts and Back are trying out for guard, with Payne the favorite for the regular squad. "University basketball sharpshooters are expecting much of Heak. He is slight and whiny and while it is not believed he will get this jump on many of his opponents, he is said to be exceptionally fast."

## GRIEF CAUSES SUICIDE

FOSSIL, Ore., Jan. 12.—Grief over the death of his wife, which occurred last June, is assigned as the reason for the suicide of Dr. D. N. Hayden of Spray, Ore. His dead body was found in bed at his home last Sunday morning and the condition of the body indicated that Dr. Hayden took his own life the previous Friday night. "The coroner's jury developed the fact in the inquest that Dr. Hayden had died from chloroform administered by his own hands. He was 45 years old. Mrs. A. Dobson of Eugene, Ore., mother of Dr. Hayden, was notified of her son's death and advised that she take charge of the body. ## WOOL-GROWERS WILL CONVENT

(By Associated Press) SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Jan. 12.—The annual convention of the National Woolgrowers' Association at Spokane, Wash., January 24-26, is expected to be one of the largest in the history of the organization, according to announcement by F. R. Marshall, executive secretary, who has offices here. Mr. Marshall said he expected approximately 1,000 western sheepmen to attend. Financial and grazing problems and the marketing of wool and lambs are among the many important subjects which will be discussed at the Spokane meeting. Mr. Marshall said. The association has completed arrangements with various railroads whereby sheepmen of Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Oregon, Washington and California may obtain special convention rates. In the future, Mr. Marshall said, the conventions will be held in Salt Lake City every other year. He said the headquarters of the National Woolgrowers' association will remain in Salt Lake City. ## BOLSHEVIK TEACHERS NEEDED IN RUSSIA

(By Associated Press) MOSCOW, Dec. 11. (By Mail).—Preparations of the young men who are about to enter the arena of life, so that the Soviet government may draw from among them not only Bolshevist teachers but also Bolshevist engineers, is the urgent task of the day in Russia, asserted Commissioner of Education Lunacharsky recently in an address to the fourth all-Russian conference of educational workers in Moscow. The commissar, who discussed the trials of education in this country today, dwelt upon the improved outlook for the future, and declared that the retreat on the education front should be considered as ended. "We must count on the students of today—the Bolshevist builders of life—to supplant those who were exhausted and worn out in the Czar's dungeons and by the storms of recent years," he said. "We have now a splendid student body which has been recruited from the ranks of the

workers and peasants. The working class and the peasantry should create their own intellectuals. The new students are superior to the old students of other days. "No matter how deficient may be the theoretical preparation of our present students, it should be remembered that in the pre-revolution period the classical colleges presented to the universities an extremely undesirable element of youth, as was attested by the statements of the old professors. We have admitted into the University here 20,000 new young men who are sympathetic towards us and who represent a creative force, capable in the near future, of co-

operating with us in our work. This will be a real mass power of a high intellectual and moral order, allied with the working masses by the closest ties of common descent. They will be the standard bearers of new Russia."
