

NEAR EAST WORK OF RELIEF BEGUN

"We have been so accustomed to thinking of Near East Relief in terms simply of its child feeding program that it is hard for us to realize that America, through the Near East Relief, is attempting a job three times as large as it ever attempted before," states D. E. Norcross, in the city for a week in the interests of the Near East work.

"Following the burning of Smyrna came the Turkish edict that all Christians must leave Asia Minor, and approximately two million more took up their flight to the sea coast. The Literary Digest advanced funds for the purchase of a shipload of supplies and has twice appealed to its subscribers to contribute liberally. It says the flight from Asia Minor is ten times worse than from Smyrna."

"President Harding," Norcross continues, "recognizing the gravity of the situation, has done what no other President ever did. He has issued two proclamations in the course of a few weeks summoning the nation to heroic giving."

"These are the reasons prompting the La Grande pastors to open their churches wide to the Near East appeal. We confidently expect that the campaign, beginning the 14th, will be carried through the county in the way in which Union County always responds."

J. J. Handwerker, state director, and Mr. Norcross will speak in the La Grande churches Sunday, and A. H. Driestow will speak at Imbler.

The work in La Grande was to have been materially aided by the efforts of Rev. O. W. Jones, but illness had resulted in removing him from active participation in the relief work.

"Farmer's Short Course" To Be Given in Alaska

(By Associated Press.) FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Jan. 12.—A "Farmers' Short Course" including an eight week curriculum in the "farthest north college in the world" is the newest plan of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, located here. The course begins this week and a number of students have enrolled. "Upon the development of the agricultural resources of the territory depends the ultimate future of Alaska," says a prospectus of the course, which adds: "A scientific study of the problems encountered is of prime importance." Subjects embraced in the course are farm crops, farm management, soils, feeds and feeding and dairying. A short course in home economics, embracing costume design and interior decorating, dietetics, foods and hygiene, sanitation and public health is also offered for the winter season. The Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines is a territorial institution, recently opened under the presidency of Charles E. Funnell, former federal judge.
