In "One Week of Love," which comes to the Arcade Wednesday and Thursday, film patrons of this city are in for a hilarious time of it.

Here are the ingredients that make the picture one of unusual appeal: A two-starring combination, Elaine Hammerstein and Conway Tearle, playing together for the first time; a story by Edward J. Montague that one may call really "big" without blushing in embarrassment; direction by George Archibald that fulfills all former promises made by this imaginative Frenchman; and a supporting cast that is not dwarfed even by the full-power starring combination.

The picture is in accordance with the Selznick company's new-half-holiday policy. That is, including "Big" stories only with crowded star casts. The company has put its best feet forward in this case, and it is to be hoped that they will make others follow in 1923. Will Hays is not the only one who will applaud "One Week of Love."

The story concerns a society girl who is seduced by the earthy and worldly pleasures and decides to take a job in an airplane. Unfortunately, she flies in the same spirit that she dances; and when her plane accidentally comes down to earth, a lot of her high-falutin' notions come down with her. She lands right in a nest of outlaws, the chief of whom is a sort of Captain Kidd of the mountains.

From this point on the story is conclusively and totally absorbing so that one wishes for an extra eye to view all the goings-on. The girl, far from being a mechanical doll that does as it is told, evinces a spirit that is at once audacious and courageous. Nevertheless, she has a battle and a half on her hands trying to ward off this God's-Country Sheik. To give away the story before it has received the key to our city would be doing it a great injustice. We can only say that it is a splendid example of the motion picture at its best and is its own excuse for being.

Osmium the Heaviest Metal. It appears that the heaviest metal is osmium, which has bulk for bulk very nearly twice the weight of lead. The specific gravity of gold is about nineteen and a quarter, while that of osmium is almost twenty-two and a half. Osmium is also the least fusible of metals, remaining unaffected by a degree of heat capable of causing platinum to run like water. It even resists the inconceivable temperature of the electric arc.

VOCATIONAL WORK URGED

Urging that every war veteran of this city and vicinity who has been granted vocational training at the expense of the government and has failed to enter training do so at the earliest possible moment, L. J. Joseph, northwestern district manager of the United States Veterans' bureau today requested also that all service men who made requests for training by letter before the application period expired December 15, 1922, file formal claim for training at the nearest office of the bureau immediately.

Mr. Joseph stated that the federal law allows the disabled war veteran a year after being discharged eligible for training to begin his vocational course presuming that the vocational handicap continues. However, if the handicap disappears during the delay, the veteran will likely lose his opportunity to learn a new trade or profession under the direction of the government, it was stated.

Details declared that the government is eager to have every veteran entitled to relief under the federal laws take advantage of the opportunities offered.

Scores of war veterans who neglected before the expiration date of training application privilege last month stymieing a desire to take up vocational training. Such requests, according to Mr. Joseph, entitle the veterans to make formal claim for training at the present time and such claim should be taken immediately.

HOUSE ON WHEELS

HOQUIAM, Wash., Jan. 13.—A log house on wheels, to give the nation a glimpse of the big timber of the northwest, is expected to leave here in the spring for a tour of the United States. The house will be hauled from a great fir log and will be seven feet wide and six feet high. It will be long enough to fit the chassis of an automobile.

The Hoquiam Commercial club is the owner of the house. C. E. Cave of Seattle will be the driver.

MANY SAVING STAMPS OUT

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 16.—Officials of the Twelfth District Federal Reserve bank announced here today that there is approximately \$35,000,000 in war savings stamps in the district that have not been presented for redemption despite the fact that they ceased bearing interest after January 1, 1923. The stamps in the district are: California, Oregon, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, and portions of Arizona, Alaska and Hawaii also are included in the district.

The bank is sending out urgent calls to have these stamps turned in before the end of this week, so that the redemption money may be reinvested in other government securities bearing interest as from January 1.

There was approximately \$80,000,000 in stamps sold in the district. About forty percent were redeemed before November 15 and January 1.

DIAMOND ROOKIES TO BE ELIMINATED

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 16.—An early and painless elimination of baseball rookies who are unable to make the grade, thus saving money for the Pacific Coast League baseball clubs adopting the plan, was announced here by George Putnam, secretary of the San Francisco club.

It has been the time honored custom to take young rookies into the training camps and then release them if they did not have the stuff on the ball. However, the Seals now plan to give the youngsters a tryout in San Francisco for ten days prior to the departure for the training camp.

If the boys show class and speed, they will then be taken along with the team and given a real opportunity. If they slip, they will be let out without embarrassment or publicity, according to Secretary Putnam. The preliminary tryout will be a secret and no one but Jack Miller, manager, Jim Scott and Joe Kelly will know who has tried and failed.

AT SHERRY'S TODAY AND TOMORROW "A FACE IN THE FOG"

Romanoff Diamond Theft Theme of appearance of Russian Princess Also Explained in Picture, "The Face in the Fog."

The mystery of the Romanoff diamonds, that wonderful collection of precious gems owned by the late Czar of Russia, has never been satisfactorily solved, but every now and then they turn up in the news. Recently a cable dispatch from Belgium announced that the customs authorities had seized a famous emerald surrounded by twenty diamonds, which formerly belonged to the great Romanoff collection. It is on a similar instance of attempted smuggling into America of the Romanoff diamonds that Jack Boyle founded his famous "Boston Blackie" story, "The Face in the Fog."

The disappearance of the Grand Duchess Tatiana, youngest and favorite daughter of the late Czar, is also another mystery that has never been solved. Accounts agree that she did not submit tamely to the fate of the rest of the royal family, but made her escape in disguise of a peasant girl. Some declare that she was overtaken and murdered by the "Reds," while others insist that she got away and there was a rumor that she reached the United States in safety, and has since lived here incognito.

Mr. Boyle's ingenious solution of this twin mystery, makes the fate of the last of the Romanoffs and the crown jewels which were the last relic of royalty rest upon the skill and cleverness of the reformed American crook, "Blackie" Dawson. How his early criminal career enabled Dawson to see through the machinations of the Soviet representatives and foil their attempts to recapture the Grand Duchess and her diamonds, forms the plot of that fascinating photoplay, "The Face in the Fog."

Where thickness of a Hair Equals a Mile THE hair of a human head averages from two to three thousandths of an inch, and if motor service shop work is based on accuracy so coarse as a "hair's breadth," only poor results can be obtained. Automobiles may be designed alike, and look the same, yet one, because of precise fits, has more power, speed and less vibration. When pistons and cylinder bores are held to limits of one thousandth plus or minus, it means that often a piston .001 under-size goes into a bore which is .001 over-size; and, in case of a three-inch piston, instead of having a wall clearance of .003 .001 for each inch of piston diameter, it has .005 and becomes an "oil-pumper"—an error of less than an average hair's breadth, yet, the results could have been no worse had it been a "mile."
