

# PENDLETON TO JOIN SIX-TEAM BALL LEAGUE

Prospects of forming a six-team baseball league with four of the clubs in Umatilla county are bright right now. At least that is the belief expressed by Lou Pison today following a trip to the west end of the county yesterday by a group of local boosters who visited baseball fans in Echo and Harriett, states the West Oregonian.

Carl Elliott, last year's president of the Pendleton league, declared that the outcome of the season for the league last season was not satisfactory to the backers of the game and expressed himself as being personally in favor of a new alignment.

Henry Hill, one of the staunchest supporters of the game of Harriett, also declared himself in favor of some such move as was suggested by the local men. The idea got forth by the local committee, which consisted of Pison, Marshall, Spelt, Bill Cary, Trace Baker and Albert James.

The men interviewed yesterday expressed only their own personal opinions and did not attempt to commit themselves to any action. Meetings are to be called within a few days to establish the alignment among the clubs in the various communities.

Following these deliberations, a meeting will be held here probably next week, when representatives of all the clubs that have been proposed for membership will be invited to be present.

One question that remains to be worked out is a schedule for a six-team league. Baseball does not present an attraction after the weather improves, and schedule matters are complicated with the necessity of arranging the number of games down to a basis where it will be secured.
