RUSSIA ONCE LANDED HERE

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 22.—The Russian flag floated over a part of California for thirty years, from 1812 to 1842, at Fort Ross, Sonoma county, where the Greek phasel and blockhouse today mark the remnants of the Russian occupation.

The Russians came to California for colonization in 1812, after Count Nikolai Petrovich Rezanof, Grand Chamberlain, visited the state in 1805 as imperial inspector for the czar. Rezanof immediately began preparing plans for the annexation of California to Russia.

The Grand Chamberlain had unlimited money at his command and it is stated that his death saved California from being wrested from Spain by the powerful Russian government.

After Rezanof's death, Alexander Baranof, head of the Russian-American company, made an effort to carry out the Grand Chamberlain's scheme of colonization. He sent out several exploring parties to pick a site for the Russian settlement. Fort Ross was selected and history states that this site was purchased by the Russians for "three blankets, three pairs of breeches, two axes, three hoes and some colored beads."

The Russians established a station on the Farrallone Island, where seals were killed, the meat dried and sent for food to Fort Ross and other Russian settlements along the north. In 1817 the Russians made a claim to California asserting this territory did not rightfully belong to any European country. However, in 1842 they withdrew from Fort Ross, and left Alaska as their sole possession on the Pacific. Russia held Alaska until 1867 when the United States bought it for \$7,200,000.

TEN TON AIRPLANE READY FOR FLIGHTS

(By Associated Press) PARIS, Jan. 22.—One of the most remarkable airplanes ever constructed has recently been added to the French Air Service.

It is a veritable armored car of the skies with the armament of a fort. The machine is built entirely of steel and in addition to the ordinary machineguns, it is equipped with one of the famous French "75" field guns. The plane carries a supply of 50 shells for this gun, and it weighs ten tons. The craft has passed the builders tests, and has been delivered to the airframe at Villa Courlay.

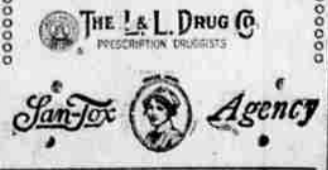
