

COLLEGE WILL HAVE HOSPITAL

University of Oregon to Establish a n Emergency Hospital to Be Located in Portland.

PORTLAND, Jan. 24.—The establishment of the University of Oregon school of medicine at Portland, at a general hospital unit with a complement of reserve officers, enlisted personnel and nurses has been authorized by the surgeon general of the army, according to a communication received by Dean Richard H. Bollen from Lieut. Col. C. L. Reynolds, U. S. medical corps, Washington, D. C. The unit will be known as General Hospital No. 46 and will be available for service in time of emergency.

There was established at the school of medicine recently a reserve officers' training corps in which medical students are trained in military hygiene, medicine and surgery. With the organization of the hospital unit, the school of medicine is prepared to do its part effectively in the event the army should call upon the services of the institution. Lieut. Col. W. A. Powell, U. S. medical corps, retired, was assigned by the surgeon general to conduct the training. Students who take the four-year U. S. medical course are eligible for first lieutenancies in the medical corps. During the world war these hospitals No. 46 was organized at the school of medicine and the officers, enlisted men and nurses who composed the unit served in France for more than a year. The hospital was financed by the U. S. army, the order amounting \$50,000 toward its equipment. The hospital unit was under the command of the late Lieut. Col. Robert Yenny, who was professor of medicine in the medical school at the time of his death.

The hospital rendered distinguished service and Col. Yenny was decorated in recognition of his services. The unit included, among others, a number of the faculty of the school of medicine who held rank as follows: Major Richard B. Dillehunt, Major Robert Louis Benson, Major Laurence Selling, Major William S. Knox, Major Wright and Lieutenant Arthur S. Rosenfeld. A number of other members of the medical school faculty saw service in other units. All of these men will be eligible for enrollment in the officer personnel of General Hospital No. 46.

OREGON FIVE IS HOPEFUL

Oregon will have its first acid test Saturday against Idaho. The Gen Staters have a strong team this year, numbering several star performers of last season, and Bohler's men win this game they will loom as possible contenders for conference honors.

"Hunk" Latham, lengthy three sport man, is moving the tower of strength around which Coach Bohler has built up an unusually speedy scoring machine. Hal Chapman, football star, and Earl Schaefer of Salem, both small but aggressive and flashy players, are working at guards with Don Zimmerman, center of last year's five, and Russell Gowans, forward. This is the team Bohler has used in the three games played so far during the season and the combination works well. There is a large squad of experienced men on the sub list, however, and the lineup may be changed before the season is over. Francis Altstock, Arvin Burnett and Haddon Rochley, all lettermen of last year, are making a strong bid for places.

The annual Oregon-O. A. C. games will be played February 2 and 3 at Corvallis and February 9 and 10 at Eugene. The Oregon team will make a tour of the northwest late next month.

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SIX COMPETE IN YACHT RACE

DETROIT, Jan. 24.—Commodore Gar Wood, of the Detroit Yacht club, has entered his express cruiser Gar Jr. III, in the Miami-Havana race scheduled for March 2. According to news about authorities here at least six yachts are expected to compete in the race, which will be run over a course straight across the gulf stream. Cash prizes totalling \$10,000 have been posted by the Consulate Nacional de Cuba. The winner will receive \$5,000, while \$2,000 and \$2,000 respectively will go to second and third place winners. The only conditions attached to the award of prizes is that at least four yachts compete in the contest.

Following the run to Havana the cruisers will race to Key West on March 4, and on to Miami on March 7. The cash prizes, however, are awarded only for the first leg from Miami to Havana.

Commodore Wood, who won the event last year with his Gar Jr. II, is expected to enter several of his speed boats in the annual regatta over the Biscayne bay course March 9 and 10. Runabouts and cruisers will be brought into action for this regatta.
