GRAIN BULGES BUFFALO DOCKS

Buffalo Harbor Over Supplied with Northwestern Grain; Fifty Millions of Dollars Worth Stored.

(By Associated Press) BUFFALO, Jan. 25.—Staring along side by side in imposing array under the lee of the outer breakwater, and tucked away in corners of the inner harbor, are nearly 100 of the largest freighters on the Great Lakes loaded to capacity with grain harvested in the American and the Canadian northwest last fall. The vessels with their cargoes, which comprise a bumper harvest of wheat, corn, oats, rye, barley and flax—are worth at present market prices about \$50,000,000. Much of the grain will remain in storage in the holds of the vessels until spring when it will be elevated, loaded into canal barges and moved to Milwaukee. Other vessels have been placed in the harbor that they can be moved up to Cleveland, leaving some time during the winter when the movement of rail will have relieved the elevators of a part of their tonnage stock.

There is a rapidly growing freighter fleet in the harbor. So the 100 freighters become storehouses for the winter, and they are a desirable for the purpose as the elevators. The largest winter cargo in floating storage this season is in the hold of the steamer William G. Arnew, of the Great Lakes, which will carry 25,000 bushels, or a total of 501,888 bushels—out of the largest winter cargoes on record. The Schoonmaker rates next, with 445,000 bushels of grain. The Agnew was among the last of the grain carriers to battle through the storm-swept lakes at the close of navigation.

Grain receipts at the port of Buffalo this season broke all previous records. The total of all grain and flour figured on a wheat-bushel basis was 295,170,364 bushels. This is the largest winter cargo in floating storage in the harbor that they can be moved up to Cleveland, leaving some time during the winter when the movement of rail will have relieved the elevators of a part of their tonnage stock.

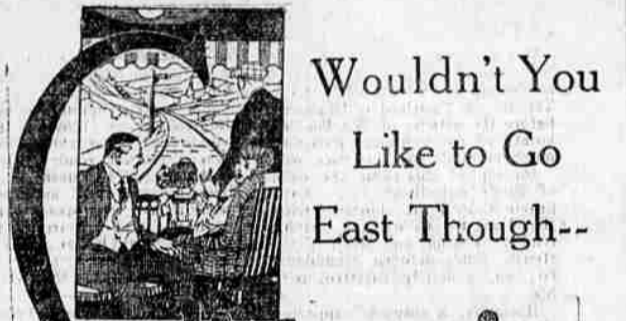
