LONDON, Jan. 26.—Yorkshire Evening News correspondent writing from Doorn says, "In spite of elaborate efforts to hide the truth have discovered that the second marriage of the former German emperor has been a complete failure. At present he is living in one part of the castle and the wife and her children in another. "The ex-emperor's mood and character is altered. He is said to have been affected very unfavorably by an operation for gland transference before his second marriage. His own children have not forgiven him for his second marriage and his step-children avoid him."

MAN SHOOTS FORMER WIFE

Pocatello Man Shoots Mrs. Juanita Graham Woodland, Then Turns Gun on Himself.

POCATELLO, Ida., Jan. 25.—As the result of a double shooting which occurred here Wednesday evening Juanita Graham Woodland and her former husband, Andrew Woodland, are in a local hospital in a serious condition suffering from gunshot wounds alleged to have been inflicted by Woodland.

The Woodlands, who were married seven years ago, were divorced last November since which time Mrs. Woodland has resided at a local hotel. According to Mrs. Mand Bemis, who has been living with Mrs. Woodland, the trouble arose over the possession of a 6-year-old child.

Shot Down in Hotel.
Mrs. Woodland occupied a room on the fourth floor of the hotel and it is said, Woodland fired the first shot at his wife in the hallway on this floor. Mrs. Woodland ran down the stairs to the first floor, receiving a second wound in the back as she ran. According to W. L. Elhart, who occupied a room on the third floor, he attempted to assist Mrs. Woodland, whose screams had attracted him but was forced back into his room by Woodland. After forcing Elhart back into his room, Woodland turned the revolver upon himself, inflicting a dangerous wound near the heart.

DIRECTOR IS GIVEN CONTROL

Stanford Athletic Executive Power Placed in Hands of Director of Physical Education.

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Cal., Jan. 26.—Executive power in the administration of Stanford athletics has been removed from the hands of the Stanford board of athletics control and placed at the disposal of Dr. W. H. Barrow, director of physical education here, according to a statement made here by Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, president of the university.

"There has been no change in the position of the board of control from that of an executive body to one of purely policy making powers," Dr. Wilbur said. "The board has been a policy making body theoretically since its institution but we have just been able to secure a man who can handle the athletic situation and relieve the board of the executive duties which it was forced to assume during and since the war because of unusual circumstances which have had bearing in other lines as well as athletic administration. "The board started purely as a policy making and advisory body but due to the lack of an executive it has been forced to add certain duties of an executive nature which it would not otherwise have assumed."

Dr. Wilbur declared that hereafter the graduate manager would occupy the same relative position in the field of Stanford athletics as the controller occupied in the financial field of the university. He said: "The graduate manager will be named to the position of all financial policies and will be responsible to the president, and, in the last instance, to the trustees of the university in all matters of financial concern."

TED THYE WINS CHAMPION BELT

Ted Thye, formerly a La Grande wrestler, but now instructor at the Multnomah Athletic club at Portland, won the light-heavyweight wrestling championship from Pete Sauer, Nelskraha wrestler, in a spectacular contest. They broke many dangerous holds and finally Sauer fell at the end of an hour. Sauer being too fatigued to return for the remainder of the match.

Thye was formerly a resident of La Grande and it was here that he first began to become prominent in athletic circles. He appeared in Union county last year matched against Duane Singh the Hindu, and is well known to local mat fans.

College Girls Vote On A Ten-Hour Day

NEW YORK, Jan. 26.—With the eight-hour day for women the predominant cry in industry, a ten-hour day for college women, six days a week, is the proposal just announced for Harvard College by the board of Students' Presidents. This organization, after long study, has presented the proposal to the undergraduate body for ratification or disapproval.

The plan proposes a new point system to regulate extra-curricular activities. The Harvard girl's twenty-four hours, if approved, shall be divided as follows: eight hours for sleep, two hours for exercise, two hours for meals and social activities, and ten hours for college activities. It is estimated that the new method of extra-curricular activities would be regulated by a point system, in which each point would stand for three hours of work. No student of Harvard, under the system, would be permitted to carry more than six units of college work, a number of students would have to attend school only three days a week.
