BLUE QUINT DEFEATS ELGIN 13 TO TEN

both teams attempting a rally, striving to out point the other. Offensive plays, time after time, were broken up by the adversary and finally Elgin shot a foul tying the score. Hummelt again broke the ice and sent the score to 8-4 but with a fierce rally, Elgin added two baskets to her list and completed her

scoring, making the game 10-8 with two minutes to play.

And then the fireworks broke! Opening up with enough stuff to down a team of giants, the Blue and White overcame a terrific opposition and won the game. Lynch scored the score, Captain Metcalf sent La Grande two points ahead and Lynch converted a foul ending the game with La Grande victors by a three point margin. But that margin was just as large in proportion as was the six point margin that La Grande brought back from Elgin.

Elgin Team Five Man.

Probably not an Elgin man showed above his team-mates, but their aggregation played as one unit, with beautiful teamwork, teamwork and fair basket shooting. Neither team were up to scratch in looping the ball through the hoop but of the two, Elgin was possibly the more accurate. La Grande shot more time for the basket, generally from a longer distance, it being nearly impossible to break through their opponent's defense in order to negotiate a close shot.

La Grande Brilliant.

La Grande started Captain Metcalf at center, Funk and Smith at guards and Hummelt and Price at forwards but after about five minutes of play Coker and Lynch came in displacing Price and Funk. The personnel of the team remained the same during the remainder of the game. While their playing was excellent, neither Price or Funk were heavy enough to successfully cope with their Elgin guard and forward.

Hummelt was probably the best man on the floor with Lynch a close second and Captain Metcalf not more than a hairline behind. Smith and Coker played their best ball of the season, also. They had to!

The passing and dribbling of Lynch and Hummelt has not been equaled by a La Grande player this season and Metcalf, in the thick of every mixup, never kept the ball out of sight an instant. Play after play was broken up by La Grande's aggressive captain although he failed to score as consistently as did the forwards. Both Lynch and Hummelt were off on basket shooting, but managed to mark up a few points.

Game Was Rough.

Adding to the spectators' enjoyment, was the roughness of the game. The pace went so fast that neither basketball was out of the question and at time it took an aspect of football. One Elgin man went out on personal fouls and hardly a man on both teams had a record clear of personals. But the game was fair and fast, and everybody was satisfied when the final blast of the whistle ended the contest.

This week La Grande plays Enterprise and Joseph at La Grande, the former team coming here Friday and Joseph playing here Saturday. Both teams are sure to be close with the outcome uncertain but of the two, Enterprise is expected to be the easier to down. Joseph won from La Grande 25 to 22 in Joseph and much depends upon whether La Grande can hang the defeat sign on their banner Saturday. It will probably mean a trip to Salem if the local boys do that and if they don't, the championship will fade into oblivion.
