VOLSTEAD LAW HAS HARDSHIPS

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Feb. 3.—The Alaska bone dry law or the Volstead act must go, in the opinion of attorneys here. The Alaska bone dry law, in opposition to the Volstead act, is in effect the medium whereby a liquor case originating in Anchorage will be carried to the highest courts in the land for a final decision, attorneys here state.

Under the Volstead act a man twice convicted of offense against the law may be fined and imprisoned in the penitentiary. Under the Alaska bone dry law he may be fined and sentenced to less than one year in a federal jail. Juries deliberating on cases where the defendant has been convicted under the bone dry law and afterward tried under the Volstead act have been compelled to strike from deliberations all knowledge of prior conviction, save where it affects credibility of witnesses. For this reason attorneys say, the dual laws are ineffective.
