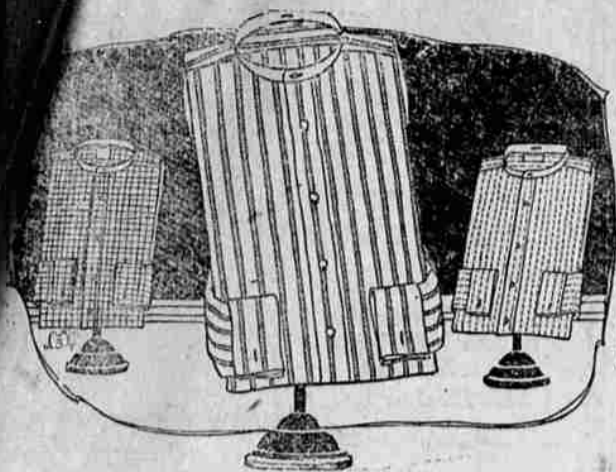

TRIO OF MEN SAVE DEER FROM COYOTES

(By Associated Press) REPUBLIC, Wash., Feb. 8.—Three men, while laying poisoned bait for coyotes on Gold Hill, four miles east of here, recently saved the life of a deer and spoiled the feast of a pack of hungry coyotes. The men were near the summit of the hill when they saw the head of a coyote a short distance ahead of them near a cluster of small pine trees. One of them fired at the animal.

Going on up to see the effect of the shot, the men found the snow dotted with blood and covered with coyote tracks, showing signs of a fierce battle. In the cluster of pine trees, a few yards away, lay a big doe, completely exhausted. As the men approached she got up slowly and limped away, her breast and fore legs torn and bleeding, multiple evidence of the hard fight she had made for her life.

Opening of Tutankhamen Tomb Reveals Startling Archaeology Discoveries

denly to become an international figure. "In his own day, and in his own place in the accepted chronology as a king of the 18th dynasty, Tutankhamen can not be credited with having been a conspicuous success. History knows him as the illegitimate son of Amenhotep the Magnificent, and as successor, after a short interval of the heretic and mystic Akhenaton, whose son-in-law he was. His short reign of eight years was a troubled era of vacillation and decadence. Feeding under the domination of the priesthood, he was induced to restore the old worship which Akhenaton had striven so gloriously to reform and reform; and incidentally removed the capital back to Thebes. My far the most interesting item connected with his name and reign is the suggestion recently advanced by Arthur Weigall that Tutankhamen and not Ramesses II is the real Pharaoh of the Oppression who taught the children of Israel to make brick without straw."

"Numerous monuments bear witness to his name, for instance a hoar of red granite now in the British museum which shows the cartouche and royal signature of Tutankhamen; a letter on clay and in cuneiform addressed to him while still a courtier, and discovered at Tell-el-Amarna. Then there are the frescoed walls of the tomb of his Egyptian viceroy, Huy, which depict Tutankhamen on his throne and receiving both his governor's report and ambassadors of tributary peoples. And the marvelous ruins of Luxor are the most superb by reason of Tutankhamen's great colonnade on which are sculptured the scenes of his triumphant reception in Thebes, the most potent structure erected by any Pharaoh up to that time."

"The practice of burial in pyramids had long since been abandoned by the Pharaohs and now the desolate chalk cliff walls on the west of the Nile had been pre-empted by the royal line and honeycombed with tombs in maze-like chambers excavated in the rock. And here it was that Tutankhamen eventually came to join his fathers. Remarkably good fortune has attended the search for these tombs, in the Valley of Kings and tourists today may look upon the mummies of some of the most famous of the Pharaohs now lying in state in the museum at Gizeh."

A short time ago Dr. Philip A. Parsons, director of the School of Social Work of the University of Oregon, delivered a radio lecture on "Prison Reform in the U. S." Letters were received from persons living in communities in widely-separated sections expressing their appreciation of the lecture service. A J. O'Reilly, county club agent of the State of Idaho, Twin Falls, wrote that he could "hear clearly and distinctly every word of Dr. Parsons' lecture."

Portland will join with the various apple-raising communities of the northwest in the observance of apple week, beginning Sunday, February 25, according to decision yesterday of the special committee representing the agricultural committee of the Chamber of Commerce. Plans for the observance to assist growers in disposing of some of their surplus stocks have been considered for some time. It is estimated that there are a total of between 500,000 and 1,000,000 boxes of apples still undisposed of in the territory tributary to Portland. At Hood River alone there is said to be 250,000 boxes and various other districts have a heavy surplus.
