576 FARMERS BORROW FROM FEDERAL BANK

Total Amount of \$2,016,400 Is Loaned Out by Federal Land Bank of Spokane in January.

(By Associated Press) SPOKANE, Wash., Feb. 9.—Five hundred and seventy-six farm loans for a total of \$2,016,400 were closed by the Federal Land Bank of Spokane during January, according to figures announced here.

During the month 565 applications for loans were received from farmers in Washington, Idaho, Montana and Oregon, aggregating \$4,236,884. Five hundred and ninety-seven loans for a total of \$1,860,780 were approved. There were 248 cancellations totaling \$1,195,500.

SALEM INDIAN SCHOOL STARTS NEW DORMITORY

(By Associated Press) SALEM, Ore., Feb. 9.—Work has begun on a new brick boys' dormitory building at the Salem Indian school. The building will cost approximately \$50,000, and it is expected that it will be completed in time for occupancy next fall. It will have accommodations for more than 200 boys.

The building is being constructed by the Indian department when bids for construction of the building were received after a federal appropriation for such a structure had been made. It was discovered that all were in excess of the amount available. Consequently the department decided to call for material bids, with the idea of the department itself undertaking the construction. The building will be 224 feet by 43 feet, two stories high. It will be of plain brick construction with a two-story lavatory wing on the back and a similar wing at the front for executive offices and other administrative purposes. Its cost is to fall within the limits of the \$50,000 appropriation.
