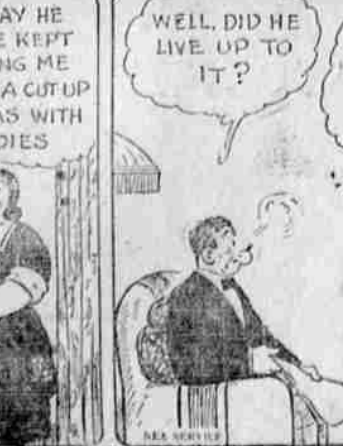

TURKS HAVE A LADY DELEGATE
PARIS, Jan. 22.—"If every Amer-
ican owner of a Turkish or an Ori-
ental rug will remember that this thing
of beauty is the work of the hands of
our women, perhaps he will change
his mind about our status as poor,
inferior creatures," recently said Mi-
llicide Haman, the first official woman
delegate sent abroad by Turkey, and
vice-president of the Turkish National
Congress, at the Angora National govern-
ment. "Western civilization should be
a charm and do not gripe or leave
nothing else," continued Millicide
Haman. "Your Turkish rugs are
made by uneducated girls and women,
often of nomad tribes. They are all
of our Turanian blood.
"Americans and Europeans favor
rather proud of their so-called civi-
lization, and they look down on us
from your heights of progress. I
wonder if you are aware that our
civilization is far older than yours. I
has lasted longer, and may still be
standing when yours has decayed.
