

# INDICTED MEN PLEA TODAY

BOISE, Feb. 14.—James D. Agnew, sheriff of Ada county; Silvester Kinney, deputy sheriff; Henry Griffith, Boise chief of police; Ed Hill, city detective; Mr. and Mrs. Carl Sorenson, Dr. Henry Goodfriend, Ed Kemp and Ed Ward, against whom an indictment was returned Monday afternoon by the federal grand jury, will plead before Federal Judge F. S. Dietrich this afternoon at two o'clock. The indicted men, represented by a brilliant array of legal counsel, appeared before Judge Dietrich Tuesday afternoon and the charges set forth in the indictment were read by S. H. McEvers, assistant United States district attorney. Henry Griffith will be defended by P. E. Savanah.

Ed Hill has retained the firm of Martin and Martin as his counsel. James Agnew will be represented by the firm of Hawley and Hawley. Doctor Goodfriend announced that he had retained J. R. Smead, former United States district attorney. Silvester Kinney has employed Claude Gibson as his legal counsel. Ed Ward, Ed Kemp and Mr. and Mrs. Carl Sorenson had not secured counsel late Tuesday.

The indictments returned by the grand jury Monday afternoon contained six counts, in which the defendants are jointly charged, with conspiracy to manufacture and sell intoxicating liquor.

# LIBRARY MAKES MONTH'S REPORT

January circulation records show an increase over last year, despite the fact that with the discontinuance of the county library many county borrowers have been deprived free use of the city library.

The total loans of books and periodicals was 4,384. Adult, 3,320, and juvenile, 1,195. Only 65 per cent of books circulated were fiction. The average daily circulation was 142. Books borrowed from the State library amounted to 29 volumes.

There were 76 borrowers, 20 of this number being juvenile. New books added, 163. Grove's dictionary of music and musicians in 6 volumes, a much needed set, was added to the reference collection. Sixty-four copies of seven-day fiction, including two and three copies of the popular authors: Beach, Bowyer, Kyne, Lewis, Hutchinson, Willis and others were put in circulation on the 12th and 13th day of the month.

Buyers were willing to pay the full 100-point advance all day, but sellers refused to offer and the market closed at the top with May contracts quoted at 5.51c, July at 5.52c and September at 5.51c.
