La Grande is also a railroad center. Lumbering is the main industry. Three large sawmills are located there. This industry gives the city the second largest payroll in the state.

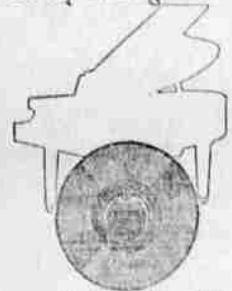
The completion of the Oregon Trail is one of the projects undertaken by the commercial club of La Grande.
