new ordinance, in as follows: city manager, who is also city engineer, \$2000; municipal judge, \$400; city recorder, \$100; city treasurer, \$125; city attorney, \$80; deputy attorney, \$40; city physician, \$15; chief of police, \$125; other policemen \$125; fire chief, \$125; other firemen, \$115; superintendent of water and streets, \$125; stenographer, \$50; head leader \$30 and janitor, \$20. The salary of the commissioners is set by other means than an ordinance.

Several other matters came to the attention of the city commissioners and were acted upon as follows: the city manager was authorized to purchase a new Ford car for the use of the city officials, a dance hall license was transferred from E. J. Powers to J. A. Stewart; some discussion concerning boxing in La Grande was in order until a later time; the annual fireman's report was received as was the annual and monthly library report. One feature of the latter report was the outlining of a proposed budget to cover the expenses of the library during the year.

Character Bids Opened.
Bids for the printing of the amended city charter were opened and the contract was awarded to the Curry Press. The new charter will be printed within a month and will be about 40 pages, with a complete index.

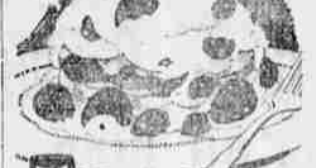
BLUE QUINT READY FOR BAKER TRIP

The funeral service of Dr. C. M. Randall at the Episcopal church Sunday was attended by a large crowd. A note tribute to the doctor in which he was held.

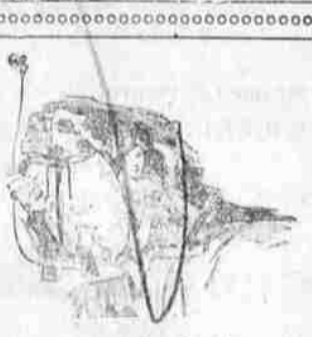
Mrs. H. H. Tundell and Mrs. G. E. Barker will entertain the ladies' guild Thursday afternoon at the home of Mrs. Barker.

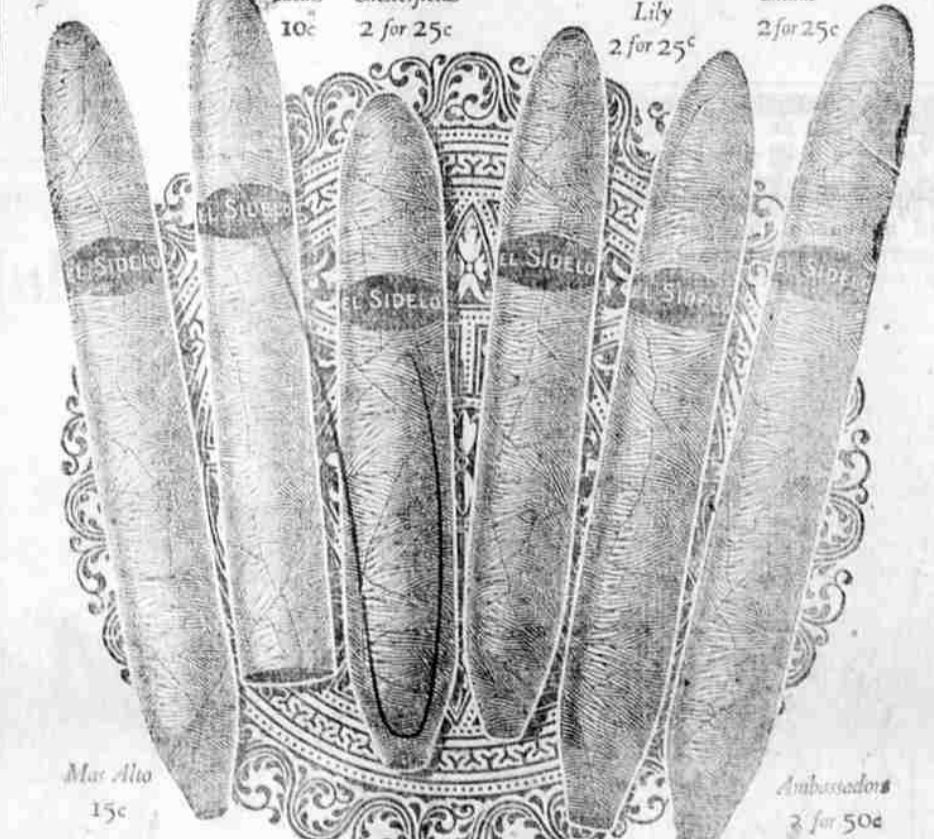
