HANDCUFF SHAKER HOLDS WORLD MARK

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 16.—An official "chaperon," who in twenty years is said to have shaken handcuffs with more alleged criminals than anyone else in the world, at Mike Burke, detective of the San Francisco police department. During this time Burke traveled several hundred thousand miles, visiting practically every city in the United States, Mexico and Canada.

"Shaking handcuffs," however, must be taken figuratively in the case of Burke. In fact, one of the most remarkable things about his record is that he never used handcuffs, chains, bracelets or shackles on any of his prisoners.

"That," he said, "is because I watch them, and they know I'm watching. There isn't any sense in putting cuffs on a man. It just makes him feel mean. I always try to make my prisoners feel good. I give them cigars, jolly them along and make 'em like it. The whole trick is to always keep between your man and the open air. When you go into a train always sit down with him next to the window and the window tight shut. When you go to bed always sleep with him on the inside of the berth."

Only once Burke almost lost a man, Alexander Walton, leader of the "chairboys" who worked the city in 1916. In conjunction with several alleged crooked street brokers, Walton, who professed to be a "peep," along investments lines, swindled his clients out of near \$100,000.

"I followed him to Chicago," said Burke, "and chased him all around the city before I could bring him back. But finally we arrived in San Francisco, and a few days later he died. Yes sir, that was one man I nearly lost. He might have died on the train coming back."

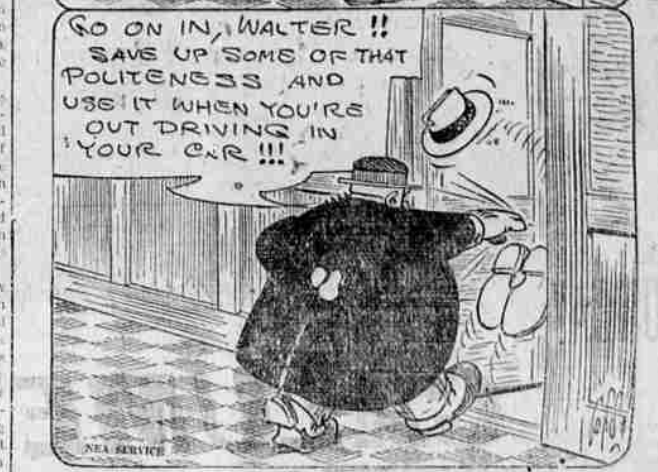

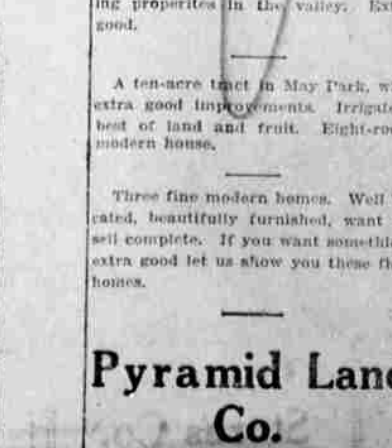
