MANY ATTEND SUNDAY TALK

"March of Nations to Battle of Armageddon," is Subject of Stirring Address.

"The March of the Nations to the Battle of Armageddon," the subject of an address in the Eagles' hall last evening proved very interesting and instructive to those who attended, a goodly number being present. The address in brief is as follows: "St. Paul states that Satan is the god of this world. World here means the commercial, political, social and ecclesiastical organization of men," states Mr. Boyd, the lecturer. "Almost all observe that an unseen evil power influences the affairs of men, causing selfishness, lying, fraud, deceit, cheating, stealing, all kinds of immorality, murder, wars, famine pestilence, revolution, etc. It is important for their own protection that all understand the cause."

"All dominion rightfully belongs to Jehovah. He created man perfect and gave him dominion over earth. God created Lucifer, a spirit being, perfect. Lucifer became ambitious and said: 'I will be like the most High (God) (Isaiah 14:14)'. I will have an empire of my own. This wicked ambition led him to cause the downfall of Adam and Eve, the first man and woman. He deceived them by telling the first lie. 'There is no death.' He is the father of lies. (John 8:44). For man's disobedience God sentenced him to death and drove him from Eden, creator of all of the human race, descending from Adam, were born; hence they were born imperfect and sinners."

"The reign of Messiah, the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unstopped, the tongue of the dumb shall speak, the old man shall return to the days of his youth (Isaiah 35; Job 33:25); the dead shall be raised (John 5:28, 29), and every man have one fair and impartial trial for life. The reign of Christ will continue until all enemies of man are destroyed, the last enemy being death. (1 Corinthians 15:25, 26). His reign, therefore, will be everlasting on earth to all obedient ones."

In Revelation 21:1-6 the Lord gives us a final picture of how his kingdom shall establish such conditions; that all tears of bitterness, suffering, pain and death shall pass away. The earth likewise shall be brought to an Edenic condition. "The destruction of Satan's empire has begun and is in progress. Let us take courage, for soon it will be fully accomplished and Christ the Messiah, in full control, will in his own good time restore to man the dominion which was lost, and the earth will be filled with happiness."
