PLAN MIGHT STOP STRIKES

(By Associated Press)
TACOMA, Wash., Feb. 20.—Co-
operation between employers and
employees on the lines worked out
by the Local Union of Loggers and
Lumbermen, will eliminate strikes,
lockouts and sabotage in American
industry, according to Norman H.
Coleman of Portland, Ore., president
of the four L.

In a recent address here, Mr. Cole-
man said that the relation of em-
ployer and employee is changing from
the status of master and servant to
that of association in industry.

"When the interests of the work-
ers are recognized they work on fair
terms to the satisfaction of their em-
ployers," he said, adding that the
four L. in the lumber industry had
proved that fact. "The new relation,"
he said, had liberated two new re-
sources, the intelligence of the men
on the job and a feeling of good-
will that is tremendously important.
