MY LIFE ON THE BURNING SANDS BY WANDA HAWLEY

Who Comes to the Arcade Thursday In "Burning Sands"

I recently spent three weeks in the Sahara desert without leaving the borders of California. That beats the famed magic carpet of "Arabian Nights," doesn't it?

You see, we were making scenes for my new Paramount picture, "Burning Sands," and "Uncle George" Medford, the director, took the whole company down to Oxnard, on the Pacific coast where there are miles and miles of sandy area that you can't tell from the Sahara. It's the same place where "The Shik" was filmed.

There we pitched camp and lived in the open. There were scores and scores of tents—the company and technical assistants numbered nearly two hundred. Our routine was like that of an army regiment. Revellie was blown at 7 o'clock. They everybody rose and peeped out of their tents to see whether or not the sun was shining. If it was sunless and gray we could turn in for another hour's snooze. That is, you could if your neighbors weren't confirmed early risers. Noise goes through canvas as it does through an apartment house air shaft.

We had a special big tent where we all ate breakfast, except the camels. Breakfast over, we were given an hour to make up. Milton Sills, by leading man, is very keen for exercise, and he always used half his make-up time working out with a medicine ball. I joined him if I felt especially ambitious.

Our "set" was half an hour away from the camp—a desert oasis with palm trees brought all the way from Hollywood by the property department and transplanted. Lyncelton was brought to us there, as it is important not to lose any valuable sunlight during the "shooting" of scenes.

Our average day of work was from 10:30 to 5:30 but much of the action in "Burning Sands" takes place at night and we frequently were on the job from 7 in the evening until midnight or 2 or 3 in the morning.

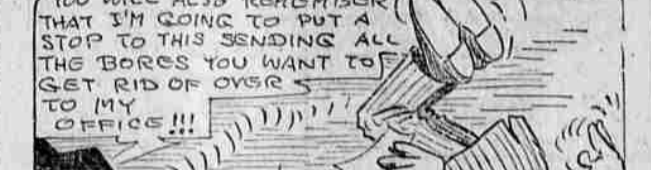

Blackfeet Indians Use Australian Ballot Now

(By Associated Press) BROWNING, Mont., Feb. 21.—For the first time in the history of the tribe, the Blackfeet Indians used the Australian ballot system in their recent tribal elections. At meetings at Seville, Old Agency, Heart Butte and Browning, where members of the tribal council were named, the new system was explained to the Indians through interpreters.

Some of the older chiefs thought it a new scheme of the "white folks" to cheat the Indians, but the younger and better educated element succeeded in convincing their elders

that it was a step toward more efficient transaction of the tribe's business.

With development of producing oil wells within a few miles of the eastern border of the Blackfeet reservation the tribe has the prospect of becoming wealthy.
