**YACHT RACE TO BE HELD ON JULY 20**

**SANTA BARBARA, Calif., Feb. 21.**—The ocean yacht race from Santa Barbara to Honolulu, Hawaii Islands, will start July 20 instead of August 12 as originally planned, according to a decision made here by the directors of the Santa Barbara Yacht club. While this decision is subject to the approval of the Southern California Yachting association, it is stated this approval was practically assured in advance.  
 This race will follow the annual regatta of the Southern California Yachting association, which will be held here during the week of July 18th.  
 The date of the ocean race was changed, the directors of the yacht race explained, because there is a better sailing breeze in July than in August and the trade winds are much more certain in July than in August in the year.  
 This will be the first time the "classic of the Pacific" has been held in 17 years. The last race was won by the schooner yacht Lurline of the South Coast Yacht club. The 2,100 miles were covered in less than 32 days.

**SUGAR BEET EXPERIMENTS**
