### SKELETON EXCAVATED IN WEST SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, Feb. 1. (By Mail.)—The well-preserved skeleton of a man who lived in the stone age 5,000 years ago, has just been found on the west coast of Sweden by a commission of archaeologists which has been combing the countryside for ancient relics to be placed on exhibition at the exhibition in Gothenburg this summer.

The Swedish experts, 15 in number, have been at work for about seven years, and have succeeded in collecting 3,000 relics of antiquity. The results of their labor have been an accumulation of proofs that the North Sea coast of Sweden was inhabited as early as 8,000 B. C.

The stone age skeleton, which is now being mounted in Gothenburg, was found during excavations at Kungälv, a few miles south of the city. The ancient one of Kungälv had been buried in a chamber by some crafts as the probably seat of a local chief, the hero of the oldest epic poem in English literature, but Beowulf was a new-comer compared with the stone age hero, who lived about 4,000 years before him.

The skeleton was brought to light by the use of lime and water, or ammonia, etc. In one of the graves about 2,000 years old, were found the remains of a woman and her equipment, consisting of an amber necklace, woman's beads and distaff.

### LABOR SHOULD HELP CHURCH

(By The Associated Press.) OLYMPIA, Feb. 23.—The attitude of the Church toward Labor should be friendly, because the aims of Labor are in harmony with the aims of the church, Edmund B. Charney, 662 New York, told the meeting of the Council of Cities of the Methodist Episcopal Church here today.

"Of the 45 million Protestants and 27 million Catholics in this country, the majority are workers," said Mr. Charney. "They go to make up the 45,000,000 more painfully employed. As the labor movement has to do with their economic well-being, they must be interested in it."

"Labor must be interested in the Church because to win the American people it must win a population of which the vast majority are church members. Labor needs the moral idealism which the church possesses."

"The attitude of Labor in Russia has been hostile to the Church; in England, much hostility prevails but it is moderated by some leaders; in the United States, where the labor movement is relatively small, we have something of the same hostility as in England and a large amount of indifference; here, many of the strongest unions are Jewish."

"The attitude of the Church toward labor in Russia has been hostile, on the continent, hostile; in England it is friendly and in the United States a spirit of hostility prevails."

"The Church is meeting the situation as shown by the work of the Federal Council, the assembling of the Y. M. C. A. to the industrial problem, the publication of the steel strike to support the Church's stand for industry."

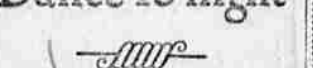

### EFFICIENCY IS NOW MUSSOLINI'S ONLY WATCHWORD

ROME, Feb. 1. (By Mail.)—Italy's ponderous bureaucratic machine, the dismemberment of which has been the promise and aim of numerous Italian governments since the armistice, is finally, under the virile and strenuous administration of Premier Mussolini, about to crumble. His government has just put into effect, through the issuance of a royal decree, a scheme designed to give the maximum efficiency for the least cost of all the services of the state.

At one blow the new decree retires all state employees over 65 years of age, and those who have served for a period of 45 years. All employees who, by reason of incapacity, are not able properly to perform the

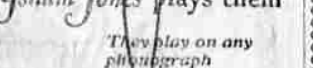

functions, for which they are employed, are to be dispensed with. This will include those whose services are not deemed satisfactory by their superiors.

A thorough weeding out of all dead wood in all branches of the government service is to take place. The decree orders all the ministers and their subordinate executives to make a complete revision of the payroll. The army and the navy and other state military organizations, such as the recently established militia, are exempted from the provisions of the decree. The Italian state railroads will be dealt with in a later decree devoted to that branch of the service. The appointment of Deputy Torre as commissioner-general of railroads is also expected to take care of a great deal of the excess labor on the railroads' payroll.
